## Ducks play well, but lose to Bruins 79-75

The Oregon women's basketball team took the halftime lead over UCLA, but fell asleep at the start of the second half and fell to the Bruins 79-75 at Pauley Pavilion Wednesday night.

The Ducks fell behind 24-17 before going on a 13-4 run late in the first half to get the lead for the first time at 30-28 with 4:43 remaining in the half. The Ducks led by as many as six points in the first half at 36-30 after a three-point play by Sara Wilson with 1:51 left in the half, and took a 40-37 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Bruins heated up at the beginning of the second half and went on 12-0 run, led by superstar forward Natalie Williams who scored six points during the run. Williams had a huge night, finishing with 27 points and 21 rebounds.

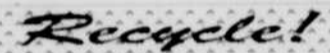
Debbie Sporcich scored to end the Bruins' run, but Williams followed with two free throws and guard Michelle Palmisano hit a three-pointer to boost the Bruins lead back to 54-45 with 13:23 left in the game.

The Bruins kept their lead around 10 points for most of the second half before the Ducks made a late run. Oregon trailed 75-66 when Cindy Murphy hit a layup and Jessica Schutt followed with a jump shot to get the Ducks within five points with 3:18 left to play, but the Bruins held on.

Schutt and Missy Stowell led the Ducks with 15 points apiece. Oregon finished the game shooting 51 percent from the field, but UCLA caught fire in the second half and shot 66 percent for the half and finished the game at 51.4 percent.

## Green hopes to rally student enthusiasm

Jerry Green is doing everything he can to bring fans back to McArthur Court.

As the first-year head coach of the Ducks, Green introduced his team in a Halloween night midnight practice, has brought a new up-tempo style of play to his team and will be on campus today at 12:30 p.m. for a pre-game rally at the EMU courtyard.

"I've been trying to get some enthusiasm back into the students," Green said. "The thing that would help us more than anything would be to get that sixth man back at Mac Court."

Still, "The Pit" has been barely half-full for games this season. Green has done everything he can to strike up enthusiasm. Now it's the players' turn.

The Ducks — who are 7-7 and 0-2 in the Pacific-10 Conference — will get their chance to prove themselves tonight when they face 15th-ranked UCLA at Mac Court. A win could go a long way in getting the attention of Oregon basketball doubters.

If history holds any significance in tonight's game, the Ducks' chances are slim. Oregon has lost 11 of its last 12 meetings with the Bruins, and has only beaten UCLA 13 times in 71 tries.

"Historically, there are a lot of traditions here at Oregon we need to break," he said. "That's the reason I'm here — to break some bad habits and traditions."

One bad habit is inconsistency.

"So far this year, we haven't even come close to playing as well in games as we do in practice," he said. "I think we've proved that we can be competitive, but I think we could be much more competitive if we played like we do in practice."

The Ducks will also play Saturday night against USC (8-3, 1-1) at Mac Court. Both games start at 7:00 p.m.
