Scott Auerbach will be counted on to anchor the Oregon defense this season. One of the most physical players in the conference. Auerbach was second among Duck defensemen in assists with six last year.

The Ducks will look to the line of Darin Varzali, Damian Jorgensen, and Lyle Grant to supply the offensive firepower for the team. The three combined for 14 goals and 20 assists last season. Brian Clendenin, a former figure skater who is the quickest Oregon player, will also be expected to contribute offensively.

John O'Donnell and Ross Sanders will battle for the starting goaltender job. Sanders played on the first Oregon hockey team three years ago and has spent the previous two years studying and playing hockey in Furnie.
