

## OCA forms Idaho group

BOISE, Idaho (AP) - The Oregon Citizens Alliance has established an Idaho group to promote a ballot initiative similar to Oregon's failed Measure 9.
But OCA Chairman Lon Mabon and Kelly Walton of Burley, Idaho, leader of the new Idaho Citizens Alliance, were met by about 50 vocal gay rights advocates Wednesday at a Statehouse news conference.
While members of the American Civil Liberties Union's Gay and Lesbian Rights Task Force and others carried signs and shouted "Shame" and "Lies." Mabon and Walton outlined their plans for what they call a grassroots, multi-issue, pro-family political organization

The initiative also says the amendment shall not nullify amendment shall not nullify
county, state or federal civil rights protections "based on race, religion, color, sex, marital status, familial status, na tional origin, age or disability"
Additionally, no citizen mav be denied county or city se vices. licenses or approvals based upon "perecived or actual lawful sexual practices. Acrording to a press releas from the No Special Rights Committee, the changes were made to accommodate con

voters and "still accomplish our intent of stopping the homosexual agenda.
Eight of the 32 initiatives are county charter amendment initiatives. The other 24 are charter amendment initiatives for cities including Veneta. Cottage Grove Junction City, Creswell and Oakridge
Neet said the new initiatives target cities and counties where Measure 9 passed with 55 perent to 60 percent of the vote.
"The idea did not originate with the central office," Neet said. "As early as election night we had representatives on the grass-roots level calling us beg. ging, 'Let's don't stop here.
Kelley Weigel, who served on the steering committee for No on 9 Lane County, said the committee has continued its work since defeat of Measure 9 in anticipation of a new OCA campaign.
"(The announcement) did not come as a surprise," Weigel said.
"It doesn't change the nature of our work, just the time frame of it." Weigel said. "It's a long uphill battle, but 1 think well be victorious. judge bans anti-gay law
DENVER (AP) - A judge late Thursday temporarilv blocked Colorado's anti-gay protection law from taking effect Friday while he decides whether to issue a more permanent order.
The law was to take effect at 12:01 a.m. Friday; Denver District Judge Jeffrey Bayless said he would announce at a hearing a 4 p.m. Friday whether he would extend the ban. He has heard testimony in the case all week.
Amendment 2, approved by Colorado voters on Nov 3, prohibits state and local governments from passing aws that protect homosexu als from discrimination Laws on the books in Boul der. Denver and Aspen that protect homosexuals from protect homosexuals from discrimina

The measure has provoked a national outcry by homosexual-rights support ers and has spurred several major cities and national or ganizations to boycott Colorado. Several major conventions have been canceled and some celebrities have shunned Aspen as a vaca tion spo
Before Bayless order Gov. Roy Romer had said he would sign Amendment 2 into law late Thursday unless the judge directed him not to.
