

# Heavyweights lead Ducks to first two dual meet wins

Oregon heavyweights dominated their weight divisions as the Ducks won their first two dual meets of season against Boise State and Brigham Young University over the weekend.

The meet against Boise State Saturday was a classic dual meet, with the lead alternating between the two teams after each match. The Ducks and Broncos split the first six matches, with Boise State holding a slim 14-12 lead.

Matt Sprague gave Oregon a one point team lead with a 3-1 win over Allen Enos at 167 pounds. Sprague and Enos were tied 0-0 going into the third period, but Sprague scored a reversal early in the period. Enos escaped, but was unable to take Sprague down before the match ended.

Boise State's Paul Jackson then defeated Scott Buzzard in the 177 pound match, giving

the Broncos a 17-15 lead with only two matches remaining.

From the beginning of the 190 pound match, it was obvious Oregon's Jeff McCoy would win, the only question being whether he could pin his opponent, Richard Conti. McCoy, leading 7-0 in the second period, put Conti in a position where his heels were touching the back of his head. Conti struggled for nearly a minute before the referee signaled a fall, giving the Duck's a 21-17 lead.

Heavyweight Chris Anderson was then given the task of protecting the Oregon lead. It was an easy chore as Anderson thrashed Tony Vanek around the mat for an easy 10-2 win, insuring the 25-17 dual meet win for the Ducks.

After the meet, McCoy said that he knew he had a chance for a fall after the first round.

"I could tell he was getting

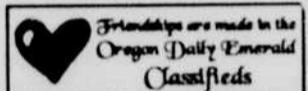
