Women go after first Pac-10 win at home

The Oregon women's basketball team will be looking for its first Pacific-10 Conference victory of the season this weekend when the Ducks play the Washington schools at McArthur Court

Oregon (0-4, 6-7) enters tonight's game against Washington State with a five-game losing streak-the last four against Pac-10 foes. The Ducks will move on to face Washington on Saturday night.

We've now reached the point where our backs are to the wall, Heiny said. "We feel we have to win both games this weekend to still have a chance of finishing in the top half of the conference

Washington State (1-2, 5-7) has lost six of its last seven games; the only win inching over the Huskies, 75-72 in overtime. Junior Camille Thompson leads the Cougars' anemic offense with 15.9 points per game. Washington State is last in the conference in scoring offense (64.2 ppg.), field goal percentage (38.1%), and turnover margin (-2.5).

Washington was a national power in women's basketball until last year when the team missed the NCAA Tournament for the first time in eight years. The Huskies (1-2, 6-6) are led by sophomore center Rhonda Smith with 18.6 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Laura Moore is averaging 14.2 points per game, and leads the Pac-10 in free throw percentage at 92.7 percent.

Debbie Sporcich is back for the Ducks after overcoming a foot injury that forced her to miss seven games, but in her absence center Sara Wilson has improved her play. Wilson ranks third in the Pac-10 in field goal percentage (56.8%), seventh in rebounding (7.8). tenth in scoring (14.3) and tenth in free throw percentage (74.1%).

The Ducks will be attempting to end a 15-game, Pac-10 road losing streak that dates back to 1990-91.


This weekend, the Ducks will have as good an opportunity as they will have all year, when they match up with co-Pac-10 cellar-dwellers: Washington State and Washington.
