The Oregon women's basketbali team fell asleep at the beginning of the second half again thursday night, and lost its sixth consecutive game, 66-54 against Washington State at McArthur Court.

The game was tied 30-30 at halftime, the third consecutive game Oregon was either in the lead or tied at halftime, but the Cougars went on a 26-6 run in the first 10 minutes of the second half to put the game out of reach.

"Somebody told me they saw the ugliest game ever at Mac Court last week." Oregon head coach Elwin Heiny said. "I think we topped it. I don't know what happened. I guess we just weren't prepared." Washington State shot just 26

the game close. Oregon shot 43 percent in the opening half but made 15 turnovers.

The Cougars came out inspired in the second half, scoring the first eight points in less than three minutes and went on to build a 52-34 lead with 12:43 remaining in the game. Washington State's lead got to as large as 20 points at 56-36 with 9:58 to play in the game, before Oregon started to put up a fight.

The Ducks responded with a 11-2 run to cut the lead to 11 points, and got as close as eight points with 3:11 left in the game, but Oregon turned the ball over five times in the final 2:48 to end any chance of victory.

Guard Karen Healea led the Ducks with 12 points, and Debbie Sporcich came off the bench to add nine points and nine rebounds.

USC's Hackett arrested for urinating on Guido's

A USC men's basketball player was arrested for urinating in public and giving false information to a police officer early last Sunday morning, according to police reports.

Dwayne Hackett was observed urinating outside of Guido's bar, 801 E. 13th Ave., by a Eugene police officer and several other witnesses. The officer said he and several passers-by watched as Hackett urinated for about 30 seconds.
