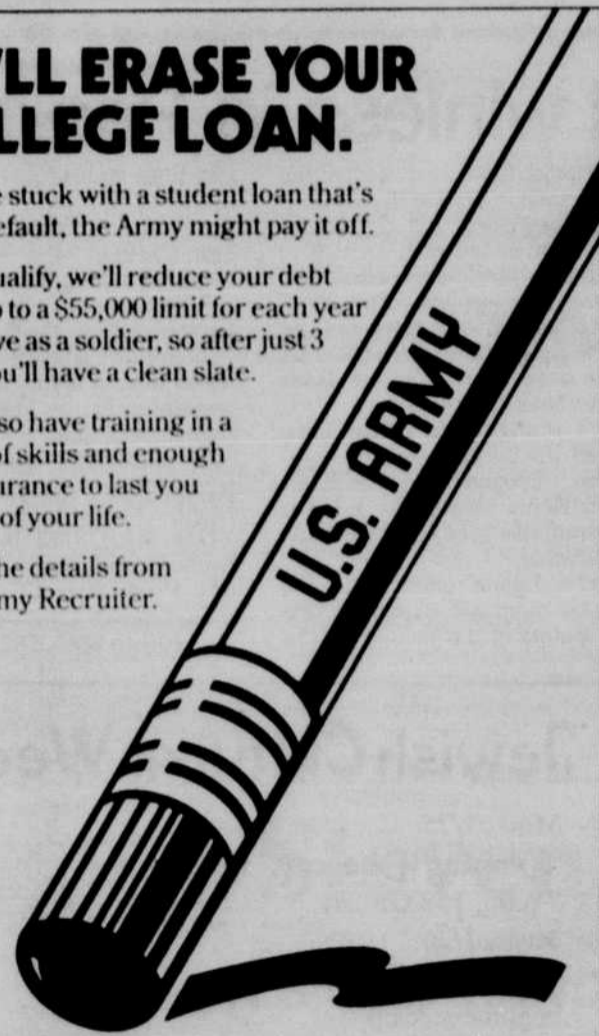

Hockey splits with Spartans

The Oregon hockey team split a pair of games with San Jose State during the weekend.

Saturday night, the Ducks lost a close game 4-3, but came back impressively the next morning and shut out the Spartans 5-0.

The two games marked the home opener for the Ducks, who came into the weekend contests with a 2-0-1 record. In game one against San Jose State, Oregon came back from a 2-0 deficit and scored three unanswered goals in front of 1,000 people at Lane County Ice.

Forward Chris Wherity led the attack with two goals within a 30-second time span at the end of the first period.

Big forward Mark Liebert continued the assault with a goal to start the second period. Steve Melkersson assisted the goal, which seemed to turn the tide of the game in favor of the Ducks for good.

San Jose State battled back with 5:22 left in the second period to tie the game with a power-play goal by Kevin Fitzgibbons.

Toward the end of the second period, it looked like the Ducks might regain the lead, but Spartan goaltender Mike Bruins made a couple of great

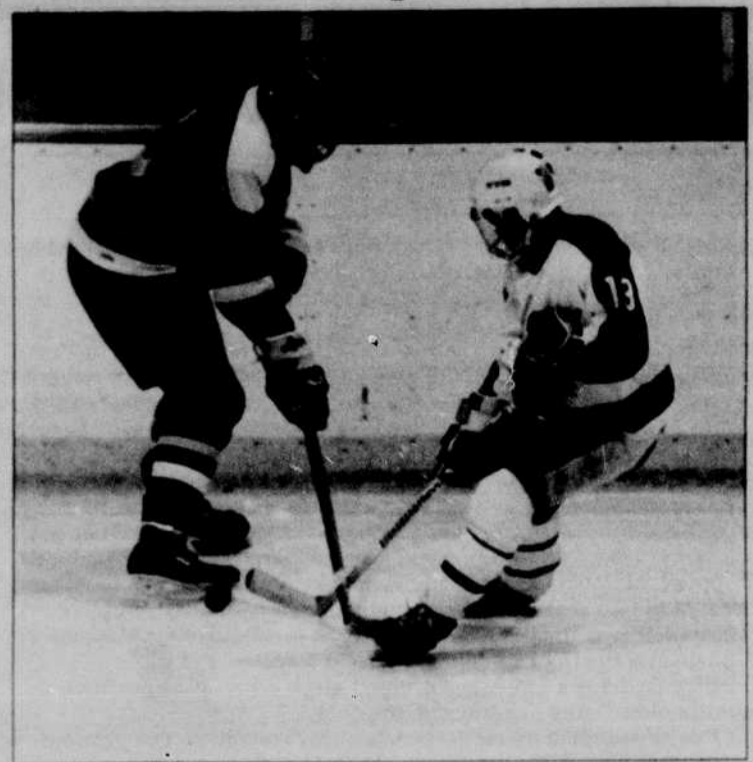

saves to rob the Ducks.

"We played great physically," Oregon forward Brian Clendenin said. "But what made the difference in the game was our lack of mental toughness down the stretch."

The two teams battled to the end with physical play. San

Jose State maintained its toughness and scored the game-winning goal when forward Tony Destro put in a wrist shot from five feet after scrambling to gain the puck with 10 minutes left in the game.
