

# **Hockey splits with Spartans**

The Oregon hockey team split a pair of games with San Jose State during the weekend.

Saturday night, the Ducks lost a close game 4-3, but came back impressively the next morning and shut out the Spartans 5-0.

The two games marked the home opener for the Ducks, who came into the weekend contests with a 2-0-1 record. In game one against San Jose State, Oregon came back from a 2-0 deficit and scored three unanswered goals in front of 1,000 people at Lane County


Forward Chris Wherity led the attack with two goals within a 30-second time span at the

end of the first period.

Big forward Mark Liebert continued the assault with a goal to start the second period. Steve Melkerson assisted the goal, which seemed to turn the tide of the game in favor of the Ducks for good.

San Jose State battled back with 5:22 left in the second period to tie the game with a power-play goal by Kevin Fitzgib-
