Assistant dean receives award

Joanie Robertson, University assistant dean of students, received this year's National Association of Student Personnel Administrators Region V Outstanding New Professional Award.

Robertson, who has worked at the University for four years, was honored for instituting the observance of National Collegiate Alcohol Awareness Week, working with a team to develop the curriculum for the University's Creating a Rape-Free Environment class and developing a number of programs on social issues that are included in new student orientation activities.

The honor, which Robertson received Jan. 21, recognizes outstanding service to a higher education institution, innovative or creative efforts within student affairs, active involvement in NASPA and other professional student affairs or-

ganizations.

Center to serve "stop-out" students

Students who are no longer enrolled at the University can receive Student Health Center care for an extra term under a new health center policy.

Under the policy, these "stop-out" students would be billed the \$57 Student Health Center fee if they used the health center after they withdrew or graduated from the University.

Stop-out" students can use the health center only for one term after they've left the University. said Elaine Jones, health center assistant administrator. After that, they must find another provider.

The policy, which goes into effect Feb. 15, is similar to a policy for students who do not attend summer school but receive health center care during the summer.

"It's going to treat (stop-out students) like any other student," Jones said. "They'll have to pay the same charge, and they'll have access to the same services.

shaven white male, 30 to 31 years old, 5-foot-10, with shoulder length dark hair and an earring

Birr said the most recent assault, a rape and abduction, occurred Feb. 2 in the parking lot of the Fred Meyer store at 60 Division Ave.

The rape was reported at 4:15 p.m. that day when a woman called the police and said she was approached in the parking lot by a man who asked her for change.

She said, "No," and turned away. When she looked back at the man, he was holding a small handgun.

The man forced her into her car and drove to the Delta Ponds area, near Goodpasture Island Road, where he raped her and left on foot.

The woman described the suspect as an unshaven white male in his early 30s, 5-foot-9, with a thin build and shoulderlength brown hair.

He was wearing an old denim jacket, a red plaid flannel shirt, jeans, gloves and a silver earring shaped like a skull and crossbones.

Possible related incidents identified by the police include one on Nov. 30, 1992, when a man with a gun attacked a Trend College student in a parking lot at 1050 Greenacres

On Dec. 26, 1992, about midnight, a woman carrying groceries to her car was attacked in an Albertson's parking lot at 55 Division Ave., across from the Fred Meyer where the latest rape began.

Wednesday morning, a 20vear-old woman whose car broke down was attacked near Sheldon High School at 2455 Willakenzie Road.

After tackling the woman, the assailant fled when a car playing loud music passed.

Birr recommended that people remain aware of their surroundings, especially in parking lots.
