Second-half lull buries Ducks

□ Oregon plays well at Gill, but loses 83-75 in Civil War

CORVALLIS — Oregon's loss to Oregon State on Saturday was no surprise.

What was a surprise was that the Ducks played nearly 40 minutes of solid basketball.

Oregon played its best basketball of the season for about 34 minutes. Unfortunately, the other six minutes decided the Ducks' fate, as they lost 83-75 in round one of the Civil War.

The loss was just another chapter in Oregon's desperate search for a Pacific-10 Conference victory, as the Ducks dropped to 0-9. The Beaver vic-

tory ended a three-game losing streak and kept Oregon State in the Pac-10 race with a 6-3 mark.

By the end of the first half, most of the 10,400 fans at sold-out Gill Coliseum were scratching their heads and wondering how heavily favored Oregon State had allowed Oregon to go into the locker room trailing only 37-36.

After all, everything seemed to be going as planned; by halftime, center Scott Haskin had 14 points, the Beavers were shooting 54 percent from the field, and the Ducks had committed 10 turnovers.

But Oregon managed to stay close by shooting 65 percent from the field and causing nine Oregon State turnovers.

"That was probably the best half of basketball we've played all year," Oregon guard Johnnie

Reece said. "We were really confident we could win at half-time."

The Beavers threatened to blow the game open several times in the half, building seven- and eight-point leads, only to see Oregon guards Antoine Stoudamire and Orlando Williams bring their team back. The two combined for 27 points on 11 of 16 shooting from the field in the first half.

"I thought we were going to win at halftime," Stoudamire said. "But those first five or six minutes in the second half really hurt us."

Oregon came out flat in the second half, but Oregon State opened the half with a 12-3 run and led 49-39 with 15 minutes left in the game.
