Women hit 12 threes in victory

The Oregon women's basketball team had strong performances from three players who attended Washington high schools as the Ducks defeated Washington State 88-75 in Pullman Saturday night.

Debbie Sporcich, Jessica Schutt and Missy Stowell scored 58 points for the Ducks, winning the second time in their last three games after beginning the season 0-10 in the Pacific-10 Conference. Oregon's victory pulled the Ducks within one game of Washington State (3-10) for ninth place in the conference.

Schutt and Stowell made 10 out of 15 three-pointers to lead the Ducks to a school-record 12 three-pointers. Oregon made 12 out of 18 three-pointers.

The game went back and forth in the first half before the Ducks


grabbed the lead for good on a three-pointer by Stowell with seven minutes left in the first half. Oregon went into the locker room at halftime holding on to a 44-41 lead.

Washington State was unable to get closer than four points in the final 18 minutes of the game. Schutt, a sophomore from Sunnyside, Wash., led the Ducks with a career-high 23 points and made five out of eight three-pointers. Stowell, a junior from Bellevue, Wash., broke out of a shooting slump by hitting six out of 10 shots, including five out of seven from three-point range to finish with 18 points and six assists.

Sporcich, a junior from Pasco, Wash., continued her strong play by scoring 17 points and grabbing a team-high 10 rebounds. Sara Wilson and Karen Healea added 10 points each for the Ducks.

Guard Erika Wheeler led the Cougars with 26 points, followed by Darci Wellsandt with 14 points.

The Ducks will return to Eugene for their final homestand, beginning Thursday night against Arizona State and followed by a game against Arizona Saturday.
