When the referee's whistle blows, Jeff Edom has his cue.

Known by most Duck basketball fans as "that guy who sings during timeouts," Edom has at times been the most entertaining part of Oregon basketball games

Edom, 27, is the director of the Oregon basketball band, but he has taken his job a step further. Besides leading the band through the ritual "game songs" like "Mighty Oregon" and "Louie, Louie," Edom occasionally breaks up the silence during timeouts by picking up the micro-phone and singing a few bars of his favorite

Edom has done his own renditions of Cab Calloway's "Minnie The Moocher" and Screamin' J. Hawkins' "Riot In Cell Block No. 9," but Edom has gained an almost cult following for his version of Frank Sinatra's "New York, New York"

A former student at the University, Edom originally joined the band in 1983 as a freshman trumpet player. It was during his stint as a band member that he got his shot

at stardom.

"One year at the Far West Classic in Port-land, the band was playing 'New York, New York." Edom said. "It was the afternoon bracket, so we were kind of just playing around. Halfway through the song, I picked up a mike and just started singing. It went over real well with the fans in Portland, so we started to do it more often."

Ten years later, after singing the song hundreds of times, Edom said he still enjoys the crowd's reaction to it.

'It may not be as fun as singing some of the stuff that, say, Harry Connick Jr. is doing," he said, "but my feeling is that the band is there to entertain the fans. And if that's the song the audience wants to hear. then we should do that.'

Edom graduated in 1990 and took over as assistant band director at New Mexico State. Edom returned to Oregon and is now a "consultant" for the basketball band this year, as well as directing the band department at Hamlin Middle School in Spring-

Edom said he does not expect to return next season, but said he would have to
