

U sit, the Irish Student Travel Service, in association with Trinity College Dublin, offers a five-week summer program in Irish studies. The program provides an opportunity to develop a broad understanding of contemporary Ireland and its culture. During the first four weeks of the program participants attend courses at Trinity College and are housed with a family in the Dublin area or in Trinity College residence halls. The final week of the program is left open for independent travel.

Trinity College, Ireland's oldest university, was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I and is one of the best-known universities in the English-speaking world. The library houses the richly illuminated Book of Kells.

Encounter Ireland is a specially designed program which covers aspects of Irish literature, history, politics, theatre, and social and cultural studies. It traces the literary, historical,
