## KNOWYOUR OPTIONS - Plan ahead for a great overseas study experience

ou'll never know how much you can learn until vou study overseas. You'll learn the usual classroom stuff, but the education you get from the people and culture of another country can never be copied in a \$50, 10pound textbook with shiny covers.

You'll have a new way of looking at the world - and yourself - once you've learned how to study and adapt to a new environment at the same time. You will open up a whole new world for yourself.

There are plenty of choices, CIEE administers 42 study abroad programs in 20 countries that are sponsored cooperatively by colleges and universities. In most cases, you receive credit from the sponsoring college or university, and you will always have people around to help you get adjusted. Resident staff supervise programs on site and are available to assist you on a day-to-day basis.

You can choose from many disciplines, including languages, humanities, social sciences, economics and area studies, engineering, biology and ecology, and business. You can enroll directly into a host school, with its full range of courses, in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Chile, the Dominican Republic, France and Spain.

You can combine work and study. depending on your background and language skills, in Brazil, the Dominican

Republic, France, Germany, Indonesia and Spain:

- · Work in a company in São Paulo or as a research assistant at the University of São Paulo
- · Study in a Javanese village or an environmental research center in
- · Teach English as a Second Language in the Dominican Republic, France or Spain.
- · Work in an engineering firm following the engineering program in Germany/The Netherlands

Even if you don't have time to spend a semester or academic year abroad, you can choose one of the summer language and culture programs in China, France, Japan, Russia, Spain and the United Kingdom. Students may begin the study of a language or pursue advanced studies. The programs last from three to eight weeks.

## Planning for a Study Abroad Experience

You have to plan ahead if want to get the most out of any overseas study program. You want to choose the right country, school and program for your interests and abilities. The first thing you want to do is visit the international programs office on your campus. Check out the information they have there and talk to a study abroad adviser. Also, talk to your own faculty adviser and to students you know who have gone overseas. Ask them

what they think about the programs.
