Golfers to host tourney

The Oregon men's golf team will look for its first win of the season this week when it hosts the Duck Invitational beginning this morning.

The tournament will open with each team playing two rounds today at the Eugene Country Club, followed by the final 18 holes Tuesday at Emerald Valley Golf Club.

The Ducks are looking for revenge after finishing second behind San Jose State at the tournament last season. The field of 16 teams this year is tougher than last year, as two nationally ranked teams will compete.

No. 25 USC and 30th-ranked Oregon State are expected to be the Ducks' toughest competition, but there are plenty of other strong teams as well, including Brigham Young, San Jose State, Boise State and Cal State Northridge.

"This is definitely a better tourney than last season," Oregon's first-year head coach Steve Nosler said. "Teams know the quality of our golf courses are good, and they want to come here."

Oregon senior Jeff Lyons will be looking to defend the individual title he won last year when

he shot a final-round 69 to finish at 2-under-par 214. Lyons, an All-American last season, struggled through the fall and has seen his stroke average rise to 74.3.

"I am not happy with my performance so far this season," Lyons said. "I have made some changes for the better, and I believe my game is coming around. There is a little pressure to defend my title, but I like that. This is my third time in the tournament, so I know what to expect."

Oregon sophomore Ted Snaveis coming off of a third-place finish in the Big Island Intercollegiate in Hawaii last month, where he shot a 2-under-par 214. including 69s in the first and third rounds. Snavely's performance in Hawaii dropped his scoring average to 74.4 and vaulted him into the No. 1 slot for the

"I feel pressure playing No. 1 because that is where Jeff has always been," Snavely said. "I am hitting the ball good and gaining confidence. If I putt well and have a good short game, I should play good."

Other top individuals in the field are David Lebeck of Boise State, Jeff Sanday of Cal State Northridge, Portland's Paul Hanson and Chris Zambri of USC.

in the final 8:30 of the half and trailed 25-12 at halftime.

In total, Oregon made two of 20 shots, and committed 16 turnovers in the first half. But the Ducks somehow stayed in the game with defense that held the Beavers to 11 of 25 shooting and sent Oregon State to the free throw line only

"When you shoot 10 percent, you're lucky to give yourself a chance," Oregon head coach Jerry Green said. "The good thing about the first half was our defense was decent."

The Ducks equaled their first-half field goal total within the first minute of the second half, as Stoudamire hit back-to-back shots that started

Oregon on a 16-6 run to cut the lead to 31-28 with 14 minutes left in the game.

Oregon State guard Brent Barry gave the Beavers a boost with eight straight points to build the lead to 43-35 with six minutes remaining.

After Stoudamire scored at the 3:15 mark, the Ducks were within five at 47-42. Then things got wild.

Stoudamire was whistled for a foul, and then Greec picked up a technical foul. Charles McKinney missed all three free throws as a hostile Mac Court crowd taunted him.

Oregon State's Mustapha Hoff nailed a short jumper with two minutes left, but McKinney was called for a foul and a technical after pretending to try and kick the referee.

Stoudamire hit three of the

four free throws to make the score 49-45 with 1:49 left.

A frustrated McKinney then threw an elbow after being fouled by Oregon's Jon Mitchell, and the Beaver was thrown out of the game.

Oregon State's Pat Strickland and Stoudamire each hit one of two free throws on the foul calls, and the Ducks still trailed by four. Oregon had a chance to cut the lead to two, but Stoudamire missed a jump shot with 54 seconds remaining. and the Beavers hit four of six shots down the stretch for the victory.

The two teams combined to commit 46 turnovers and totaled only 17 assists.

Hoff led Oregon State with 14 points, and Barry scored all nine of his points in the second
