Ducks lose gruesome one

A crowd of 8.681 fans showed up at McArthur Court Saturday night to watch two teams play in the Civil War.

The Oregon softball team evened its season record at 4-4 by winning four of six games during the weekend at the Capital Classic in Sacramento, Calif.

The Ducks won two games Friday and Saturday before losing 2-1 to San Jose State in the quarterfinals of the tournament.

The Ducks opened the tournament by defeating tournament host Sacramento State 1-0, one week after falling to the Hornets 7-2 in Las Vegas. Oregon catcher Laura Schmidt broke a scoreless tie in the bottom of the sixth inning with her second home run of the season, giv-

Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching

he late Mr. A. J. Ersted established the Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching so the University of Oregon could annually honor faculty members "who have taught comparatively short periods and have demonstrated exceptional abilities to induce students to reason and not merely memorize." The Ersted Awards can go only to faculty who are early in their teaching careers. This teaching may occur at the undergraduate or graduate level.

he University of Oregon wishes to continue the tradition of the Burlington Northern Foundation Faculty Achievement Award For Distinguished Teaching by instituting an award which will honor a senior faculty member who has achieved an outstanding record as a teacher.
