## Ducks lose gruesome one

A crowd of 8,681 fans showed up at McArthur Court Saturday night to watch two teams play in the Civil War.

Someone apparently forgot to notify the teams.

Oregon and Oregon State — who had combined to win only four of their last 25 games — slipped, slobbered and stunk their way through 40 minutes of "Pac-10" basketball, with the Beavers eventually winning 54-48.

"It was a very ugly game," said Oregon forward Antoine Stoudamire, who led all scorers with 25 points. "This game was uglier than the USC game earlier this season. It was still exciting, but it was ugly."

Without a doubt, the ugliest stat of the game was the fact that the Ducks made 10 percent (that's right, 10 percent) of their shots in the first half.

The Ducks managed to hit seven of their last eight free throws, but failed to make a field goal

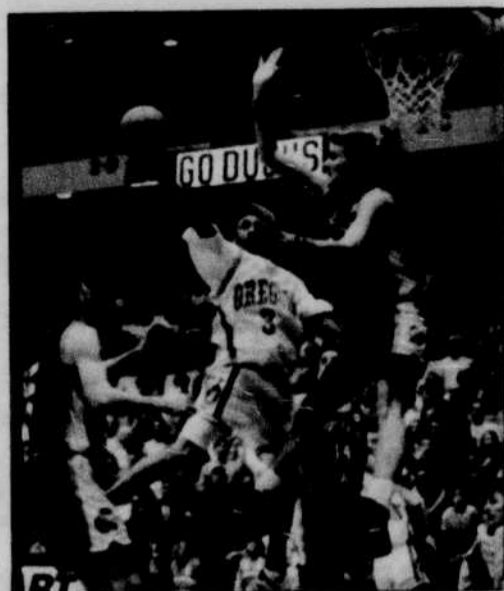

## Softball goes 4-2 at tourney

The Oregon softball team evened its season record at 4-4 by winning four of six games during the weekend at the Capital Classic in Sacramento, Calif.

The Ducks won two games Friday and Saturday before losing 2-1 to San Jose State in the quarterfinals of the tournament.

The Ducks opened the tournament by defeating tournament host Sacramento State 1-0, one week after falling to the Hornets 7-2 in Las Vegas. Oregon catcher Laura Schmidt broke a scoreless tie in the bottom of the sixth inning with her second home run of the season, giving Oregon a 1-0 lead.

### Eligibility for Awards

#### Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching

The late Mr. A. J. Ersted established the Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching so the University of Oregon could annually honor faculty members "who have taught comparatively short periods and have demonstrated exceptional abilities to induce students to reason and not merely memorize." The Ersted Awards can go only to faculty who are early in their teaching careers. This teaching may occur at the undergraduate or graduate level.

#### Faculty Achievement Award for Distinguished Teaching

The University of Oregon wishes to continue the tradition of the Burlington Northern Foundation Faculty Achievement Award For Distinguished Teaching by instituting an award which will honor a senior faculty member who has achieved an outstanding record as a teacher. The Faculty Achievement Award for Distinguished Teaching can go only to a faculty member who has held academic rank at the University of Oregon for at least seven years, and who has demonstrated excellence in teaching at the undergraduate or graduate level.
