

# Men third after first two rounds

The Oregon men's golf team overcame tough conditions and inconsistent play to move into third place heading for the final round of the Duck Invitational at Emerald Valley Golf Club today.

The Ducks shot a two-round total of 601 during the first day of competition Monday at Eugene Country Club, placing them four shots behind defending champion San Jose State and three shots behind Brigham Young, USC and Washington are close behind the Ducks with scores of 603 and 606, respectively, with Long Beach State and Boise State at 608.

"I am glad we're still in it," Oregon head coach Steve Nosler said. "We are within striking distance, but we must play better to win."

Oregon senior Paul Regali got the Ducks off to a quick start by shooting an opening-round 70, putting him in a three-way tie for first place after the first round. Lyons struggled through the second round on his way to a 78, including one stretch which saw him go six-over-par for five holes midway through the round. Lyons is in seventh place at four-over-par 148, seven shots behind tournament leader Eric Rustand of Brigham Young.

Oregon's Ted Snavely improved on an opening round 75 with a 74 in the second round to put him

in a tie for eighth place. Snavely had troubles off the tee all day but kept his scores low thanks to a good short game.

"I hit my driver awful and my short game was on and off," Snavely said. "I have to hit the ball better on Tuesday and keep focused."

Senior Cam Martin recovered from a disastrous opening-round 79 with an even-par 72 in the second round. Martin is a member of Eugene Country Club and has played it for years, but he said the course was set up as tough as he had ever seen it.

"The tees were pushed back and the course played soft," Martin said. "The wind increased in the second round and that also made the course tougher. The first round I was hitting the ball everywhere, but I began to hit greens in the afternoon."

Sophomore Paul Regali finished the day at 153 after shooting a 76 in the first round followed by a 77 in the afternoon. Junior Randy McCracken shot back-to-back 79s to finish at 158.

The tournament concludes with 18 holes at Emerald Valley Golf Club beginning at 8:15 a.m. today. Nosler says he does not expect any difference in the scores despite the change of courses.

"The country club played difficult today, so I don't think scores were that high," Nosler said. "Emerald Valley is just as difficult, so I think the scores will be comparable."

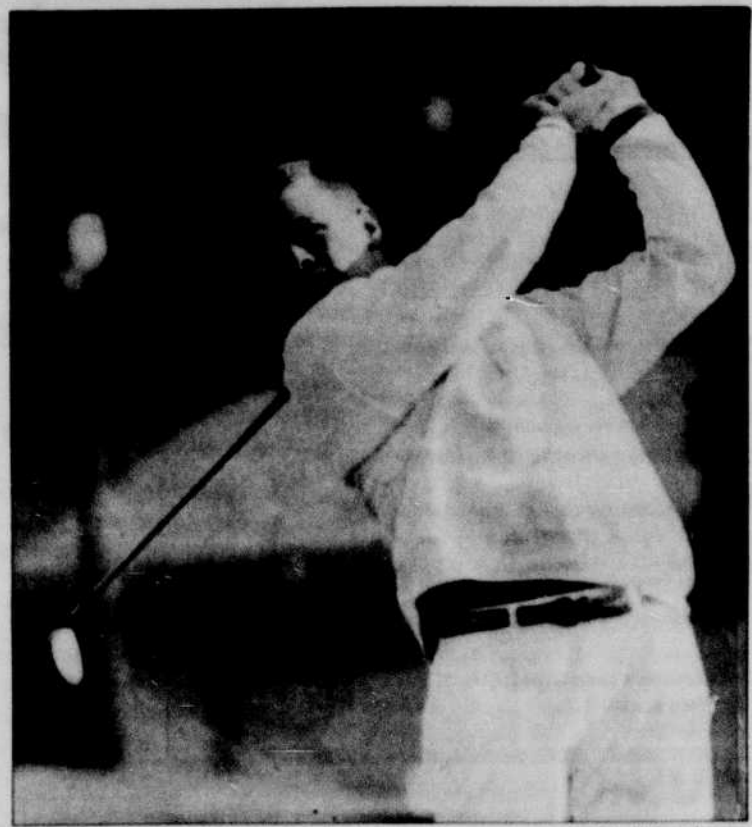

### Eligibility for Awards

#### Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching

The late Mr. A. J. Ersted established the Ersted Award for Distinguished Teaching so the University of Oregon could annually honor faculty members "who have taught comparatively short periods and have demonstrated exceptional abilities to induce students to reason and not merely memorize." The Ersted Awards can go only to faculty who are early in their teaching careers. This teaching may occur at the undergraduate or graduate level.

#### Faculty Achievement Award for Distinguished Teaching

The University of Oregon wishes to continue the tradition of the Burlington Northern Foundation Faculty Achievement Award For Distinguished Teaching by instituting an award which will honor a senior faculty member who has achieved an outstanding record as a teacher. The Faculty Achievement Award for Distinguished Teaching can go only to a faculty member who has held academic rank at the University of Oregon for at least seven years, and who has demonstrated excellence in teaching at the undergraduate or graduate level.
