## Ducks pass BYU, win at Invitational

The Oregon men's golf team shot a 4-over-par 292 to pass Brigham Young and San Jose State during the final round to win the Duck Invitational at **Emerald Valley Golf Club Tues**day afternoon.

The Ducks were in third place, four strokes behind San lose State after 36 holes Monday at Eugene Country Club, but the Spartans shot 298 on the final day to finish in a second-place tie with the BYU Cougars. The win marked the first time in three years the Ducks won their

home tournament.
"I am ecstatic," Oregon head coach Steve Nosler said. "The kids put themselves in a position to win Monday and played good today to get the win.

Oregon senior Jeff Lyons was unable to defend the individual title he won last year, but he led the Ducks with a 5-over-par 221 and finished tied for fourth. Lyons recovered from a 78 in Monday's second round with a 73 on Tuesday

"I feel like I played terrible," Lyons said, "I stuffed most of my shots near the pin but missed a lot of putts. I'm glad the team played well, but I still don't think we are where we should be."

Oregon's other senior, Cam Martin, shot a 1-under-par 71 on Tuesday including one stretch when he birdied four holes in a row. Martin began the tournament with a 79 on Monday, but he came back with a 72 in the second round and finished the tournament in sixth place with a 222 total.

"I was 4-under-par at one time, so I am a little disappointed with my score," Martin said, 'Considering I opened with a 79, I am pleased with how I came back. It could have been a very disappointing tournament, but I am happy with my last two rounds.

Paul Regali and Randy McCracken combined to shoot 23-over-par during the first two rounds, but they both shot 74 in the final round to help the Ducks to the victory. Sophomore Ted Snavely was the only Duck who struggled Tuesday, as he shot a final round 77 to finish at

Freshman Chris Bensel played as an individual, and his scores did not count toward the team totals. He shot a final round 69 to finish tied with Lyons at 221. Jeremy Forster also played as an individual, and he shot 74 in the final round to finish tied for 14th place at 225. Oregon's other individual, Alex Nakajima shot 80 on Tuesday to finish at

Nosler said he was excited about the play of Bensel and Forster, and he feels their play adds depth to Oregon's spring

"I was happy to see Jeremy and Chris play well," Nosler

said. "Those two will compete with our other five players for spots in the spring tournaments. We will take six players to three of our remaining tournaments, so it is good to see them play well."

Brigham Young junior Eric Rustand continued his spectacular play Tuesday with a final round 72 to capture his first collegiate victory. Rustand shot rounds of 71 and 70 on Monday and finished the tournament at 213, six shots ahead of San Jose State's Steve Woods and Corby Segal of Cal State Northridge.

I think I play better on tougher courses and the two courses we played were difficult," Rustand said. "I played two practice rounds here under par, but I am surprised the other players fell back."

Rustand was never threatened Tuesday, as he shot even par on the front nine holes, while Woods, who trailed by only two shots entering the day, played the front nine at 4-over-par. Rustand erased any doubt he would win on the par-5 12th-hole when he recovered from a bad tee shot and sunk a 12-foot putt for eagle.

"I knew I won the tournament after I got the eagle on No. 12," Rustand said. "I hit a bad tee shot so I just wanted to hit my second shot as hard as I could. and fortunately I got close to the

Brigham Young head coach Bruce Brockbank said he hoped Rustand's victory would end the junior's slump.

"He got the season off to a shaky start," Brockbank said. "He didn't play very well in the fall. This win for him is super; he is a very pleasant young

The Ducks play next in the Pacific Coast Invitational in Santa Barbara March 24-25, and Nosler said he hopes Tuesday's victory will be the beginning of a good spring season.

"The ability to win is here," Nosler said. "You have to start somewhere, so this is a real important finish."
