

# Men scare Bears in final game

Obviously, the Oregon men's basketball team didn't get an invitation to the NCAA tournament.

However, the Ducks nearly threw a kink into California's postseason hopes, playing the heavily favored Golden Bears tough all the way to the final horn before losing 79-76 at McArthur Court Saturday night.

Oregon (10-20, 3-15) led by as many as 13 points in the first half and didn't relinquish its lead until the 14:22 mark of the second half. But the Ducks were still able to stay close, trailing only 78-76 when an Orlando Williams pass slipped through Andre Collier's hands with 16 seconds

remaining in the game.

California (19-9, 12-6) guard Jason Kidd hit one of two free throws with six seconds left, leaving the Ducks with a chance to tie the game with a three-pointer. But Antoine Stoudamire, who scored 29 points in his final game for Oregon, drove the ball up the court and threw up a 30-footer that bounced hard off the backboard at the horn.

The win gave the Bears a second-place finish in the Pacific-10 Conference, earning them a No. 6 seed in the Midwest Regional of the NCAA Tournament. However, without the win Saturday, they may have been relegated to a top seed in the NIT.

Oregon led by as many as nine in the second half, but the Bears went on a 9-0 run early in the half

to take their first lead at 52-50. Williams hit a three-pointer seconds later to return the lead to the Ducks, but that was the last time Oregon would lead.

Lamond Murray's three-pointer and Brain Hendrick's dunk gave Cal a five-point advantage, and the Bears looked to be pulling away after Akili Jones scored and was fouled for a three-point play to put Cal up 65-57 with nine minutes left in the game.

But Oregon rebounded with a 7-1 run to pull within two at 66-64.

From there, the Ducks answered every Cal bucket to keep themselves in the game.

## Japanese and American Studies: "Equality and Inequality"

Oregon/Japan Summer Program

- July 21-August 29, 1993 (five weeks) at Lewis & Clark College, Portland, Oregon.
- A theme course on "Equality and Inequality" explores issues of gender, race and ethnicity, social class and economy, and Japanese/U.S. partnerships as viewed by Japanese and U.S. societies. Japanese language instruction at beginning, intermediate and advanced levels is offered.
- Program fee of \$2,200 includes:
  - Tuition for 12 quarter hours of credit
  - Room/board at Lewis & Clark College
  - Books and materials
  - A 3-day outdoor wilderness experience
  - Field trips in Portland and around Oregon
- The program welcomes undergraduate students in any major with an interest in Japan and its culture. Previous Japanese language study is preferred, but not required.
- The program brings together the best academic expertise in Japanese and American studies from Oregon and from Japan's prestigious Waseda University.
- Participants interact with Japanese students in the classroom, in the residence halls, and in extracurricular activities.
- Scholarship awards (\$500-\$1,000) based on academic merit and financial need are offered. Students attending some Oregon colleges and universities may apply for financial aid.
- Deadline: May 15, 1993. Early application is encouraged.
