was not as consistent as I would have liked for him to be. He played well in the Arizona State and California games, but struggled against teams like UCLA and Oregon State."

O'Neil will be challenged by sophomore Clayton Millis, who is listed as the No. 2 quarterback on the depth chart, and redshirt freshmen Tony Graziani and Ryan Perry-Smith.

"I am looking forward to seeing all four quarterbacks this spring," Brooks said. "Millis has the most experience, but Graziani and Perry-Smith both throw the ball well."

The Ducks will see the return of the strong duo of Sean Burwell and Ricky Whittle, who combined to rush for more than 1500 yards in 1992 at running back. Fullbacks Juan Shedrick and Dwayne Jones also return in the backfield.

The Ducks need to replace receivers Ronnie Harris and Anthony Jones, who completed their eligibility last season, and there are many candidates for the job. Senior Derrick Deadwiler was Oregon's third leading receiver with 29 catches last season and is expected to lead a young core of receivers. Senior James Jessie will return at receiver along with sophomores Cristin McLemore and Kory Murphy and highly touted redshirt freshman Dameron Ricketts.

"Wide receiver is a big question mark," Brooks said. "McLemore made some nice catches last season, and Murphy had a nice catch. Ricketts is a new face, and he will be given an opportunity to play as well."

Willy Tate is the lone returnee at tight end, but he came on strong in 1992 to finish with 20 catches and two touchdowns, including the only score in Oregon's 7-0 victory over Oregon State.

Steve Hardin, Tom Curran and Mike DiFonzo all return after starting at least eight games each on the offensive line last year, but the Ducks will have to

replace David Collinworth and Jon Tattersall on the left side of the line. Justin Starck and Eric Barnes each started at least one game last season and are listed as the top players on the depth chart, but depth on the left side may be a problem.

The Ducks lost four top players on defense from the 1992 team, but their depth should make up for the losses. Joe Farwell, Jeff Cummins and Eric Castle all depart after being named to either the All-Pacific-10 Conference second team or honorable mention in 1992, and linebacker Terrell Edwards was dismissed from the team last month.

Silila Malepeai is expected to be ready for the beginning of the season, and he will be flanked by Romeo Bandison and Gary Williams on the defensive line. Bandison was named All-Pac-10 second team, and Williams had a solid season after returning from an injury.

Ernest Jones, David Massey, Jeremy Asher, John Taumoepeau and Tony Koker all return in 1993 after starting at least three games each last season. Redshirt freshman Rich Ruhl will also vie for playing time along with four redshirt freshmen that Brooks likes.

The absence of Cota and Molden will give Brooks a chance to look deeper at Jeff Sherman, Brian Collins, Kyle Crowston and junior college transfer Dante Lewis as possible contributors in the defensive backfield. Herman O'Berry, who led the Ducks last season with seven interceptions, will return at right cornerback.

Brooks hired former outside linebackers coach Nick Aliotti as the new defensive coordinator, replacing Denny Schuler, who left to take the offensive coordinator job at California. Despite the change, Brooks said the defense will remain basically the same.

"I don't expect any differences on defense," Brooks said. "I am happy with what we have done in the last four or five years on defense, and I expect it to continue."
