relay team that should break the Oregon school record of 45.5 seconds by the end of the season. Last week, the relay team won the Stanford Invitational title, defeating three other Pac-10 schools in the process.

After a redshirt season, Kelly Blair returns to the squad, and is capable of outscoring some lesser conference opponents singlehanded. Blair has already qualified for the NCAA Championship Meet in the heptathlon, and she should also qualify in the high jump and 400 meter hurdles.

Ashley Selman, the NCAA avelin champion in 1990 from USC, is now officially a Duck. Selman has been an all-American her previous three years of competition.

With the additions of Godfrey, Blair, and Selman, many feel that Oregon will have its best women's track team since 1988. when the squad took third at the NCAA championship.

The following is a run-down of the team by event:

Sprints — Jones made school history last year when she became the first Oregon woman sprinter to earn an all-American certificate by taking fifth place in the 400 meter sprint. With Jones anchoring, Oregon could qualify relay teams for the NCAA meet for the first time since 1981.

Junior Shawna Krasowski, a transfer from Lane Community College, and Nilka Thomas, the 400 meter Alaska prep record holder, will add depth to the 200

and 400 meter events.

Distances - Nicole Woodward returns as the only runner with NCAA experience, having placed 10th in the 5000 meters last season. Jenna Carlson won the Stanford Invitational 3000 meter race last week, proving she can run among the conference leaders.

Jill Callero took third in the Pac-10 meet last season at 10,000 meters, and freshman Heidi Van Borkulo-Goldstein was the top Oregon finisher at the November NCAA Cross-Country meet.

Jumps - The Ducks have two high jumpers who have cleared 5'10" in Blair and junior Amo Olsen. Kelsey Stellick has decided to give up the heptathlon in order to concentrate on the high jump, so she should improve dramatically on her 5'5" personal record.

Sara Howell will remain busy during meets, as she plans to jump as well as run hurdles. Howell has a lifetime best of 39'7" in the triple jump and 18'9" in the long jump.

Throws - Julie Beck is the only experienced shotputter on the squad. She will look to improve upon her fifth place finish from a year ago. The javelin will once again be the Duck's deepest throwing event, as Keri Easterbrook, Tonia Roth, and Stellick, along with Selman. could score at the conference
