Of the the 60 athletes listed on the Ducks' roster, 20 of them are either true or redshirt freshmen, the most impressive of whom are true freshmen Ray Livingston, Michael Katri and Jeremy Robinson who all start their careers at Oregon with prep all-American credentials.

"Half of our team is new faces this year," Dellinger said. "We could develop into one of the better teams in the country in the next three or four years. It will be interesting watching this team develop."

Here's a breakdown by event.

Sprints — This season, Harris will lead the way for the sprinters and could see action in all three distances (100, 200, and 400 meters). Harris finished fourth in the 100 at last season's Pac-10s. Three football players, Hosey, Deadwiler and Kory Mur-

phy will join O'Connor and LaVon Pierce and newcomers LaMont Woods, DeWayne Ingrams and Patrick Khoo to give Dellinger a nice cast to work with in the sprints. O'Connor, Pierce and Harris were all a part of Oregon's best 4 x 400 relay team last season.

Middle Distances — Last year's top 800 and 1,500 meter runners (Shannon Lemora and Alan Foster) are both gone, leaving the door open for Hollister, a sophomore. Hollister ran well toward the end of last season and had a good cross country season in the fall.

Oregon also has Katri and transfer Gordon Johnson in the 800. Katri is a former California state champion in the distance, and Johnson finished first in the 800 at the Oregon Preview over spring break.

Distances — Strong performances during Oregon's cross country season has the Ducks looking good for the spring. Fresh-

man Karl Keska could be the Ducks' strongest distance runner. He had a strong first-place showing at the Oregon Preview after leading Oregon to an eighth-place finish at the NCAA cross country championships.

Hurdles — Finding a replacement for Bob Gray could be one of the toughest tasks Dellinger faces this year. O'Connor is one of the team's best athletes and ran his all-time best in the Pac-10s last season. Ylitalo, a senior, will back up O'Connor, as will Sol Sallos in the intermediates.

Finding a replacement at in the 110-meter event could be difficult. Freshman Jamar Williams is Oregon's best hope in the event, and he also finished first at the Oregon Preview.

Jumps — In the triple jump, Pac-10 scorers Hosey and Bleakney will be joined by Sweden's Erik Balstrom to form a strong

crew in the event.

Livingston was the Oregon state prep champion last year, and he is the Ducks' best hope in the long jump.

Livingston will also compete in the pole vault, and will be joined by senior Derek Snelling who finished eighth at the Pac-10s last season. Matt Binkard and J.J. Shephard will give added support in the event.

Walton, a senior, is the top returning high jumper after finishing fifth in the conference last year. Stan Burton and Eric White are close behind Walton.

Throws — Heath Howington will see double duty in the shot and discus after finishing seventh in the shot last season. Craig Ragan will be Oregon's top javelin thrower this season, and freshmen Dustin Carlson and Robinson will carry the load for the Ducks in the shot and hammer, respectively.
