Shannon Maier, Christel Tomori and Leigh Casey all placed in the Top 10 in their last tournament, and they will compete for the Ducks again this weekend.


Karly Mills will play for the Ducks after tying for 19th in Utah, and Cappy Mack will round out the Oregon lineup.
