Faculty strike ends in Cincinnati

CINCINNATI (AP) — Negotiators for the University of Cincinnati and striking faculty members reached a tentative agreement on a three-year contract Saturday, ending a five-day strike.

Members of the American Association of University Professors' campus chapter, which represents 1,916 full-time faculty members, must approve the pact. No date was set for a ratification vote.

The strike has kept about 40 percent of the bargaining unit's members from classes since it

began Monday. About 35 percent of classes were canceled each day, the university said.

The contract includes no pay raise during the current school year but does call for pay increases of 2 percent in the 1993-1994 school year and 4 percent the following year. Currently, the average faculty salary is \$51,000.

Both sides also agreed that a \$2.8 million retirement incentive will be distributed first to health benefits for retirees and then to a development fund administered by the department.

Lowell Leake, a union spokesman, said the administration dropped its demand to be able to suspend a faculty member without pay before a hearing.

The university also agreed to restrict its ability to switch a professor from a tenure-track position to a non-tenure-track position, except for clinical faculty in the medical school, Leake said.

The contract is retroactive to last fall, when the old contract expired.

Actress settles lawsuit

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Geena Davis settled a lawsuit that claimed a journalist invented quotes in a profile of her.

Terms of last week's settlement with Frank Sanello weren't disclosed.

"Both sides are pleased with the settlement, and I now hope to get back to work now that this nightmare is over," Sanello said.

The 36-year-old actress sued for \$5 million for invasion of privacy after Sanello's article appeared in the December issue of *Woman's World* magazine.

The story, titled "Geena Davis — I Want to Have a Baby," discussed her relationship with Hollywood security consultant Gavin de Becker.

Davis, who starred in *Thelma and Louise*, *A League of Their Own* and *The Fly*, won an Academy Award in 1988 as supporting actress in *Accidental Tourist*.

Moviegoer sprays mace

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — A woman refused to be quiet during a showing of the movie *A Fire in the Sky* and sprayed Mace in the face of a patron who asked her to shut up.

The assailant fled after the incident Wednesday. The maced woman was treated at the theater by paramedics.
