

Men golfers fade to third in Fresno

The Oregon men's golf team started quickly but faded late to place third during the weekend at the Fresno Golf Classic in Fresno, Calif.

The Ducks shot 284 in the opening round Friday, followed by 297 in the second round, to take a five-shot lead heading into the final round. But Oregon shot 304 in the third round to finish seven shots behind UCLA. Jeff Lyons was the top finisher for Oregon, shooting a 218 to finish in sixth place.

The Ducks came out on fire Friday morning and were paced by Ted Snavelly's 69 and Randy McCracken's 70 to take a two-shot lead over Fresno State after one round. Lyons added a 72, and Cam Martin shot 73 in the opening round.

Martin was the only Duck who was able to better his score in the second round, coming in with a 72, while the rest of the team faded. Snavelly shot a second-round 74, followed by

Lyons and McCracken with 75 and 76, respectively. Snavelly was in third place after two rounds, while Martin, McCracken and Lyons were all among the top 13.

Lyons came on strong in the final round Saturday morning and shot 71, while the rest of the team struggled even worse than they did in the second round. Martin shot 77, followed by McCracken and Snavelly, who shot 79 and 80, respectively. Martin finished with a total of 222 shots to finish in 11th place, and Snavelly finished 17th with a 223 score. McCracken finished 23rd at 225.

Oregon's final two golfers, Paul Regali and Jeremy Forster, struggled through the tournament and finished at 235 and 242, respectively.

UCLA won the tournament with a three-round total of 878, and Scott Peterson of Colorado won the individual title with a three-under par 213.

The Ducks will travel to West-

lake Village, Calif., to play in the Southwestern Intercollegiate today and Tuesday. Lyons will be looking to defend the individual title he won at the tournament last year.

The Oregon women's golf team finished ninth at the Ping/Arizona State Invitational Sunday with a 54-hole total of 941.

Third-ranked Arizona State won with an 897, five strokes in front of runner-up San Jose State.

Nine of the 17 teams in the tournament were ranked in the top 20, including five of the top 10 teams in the nation.

Junior Cappy Mack paced Oregon with a 233, tying for 28th. The Ducks' Shannon Maier finished at 32nd with a 234.

Stanford's Martha Richards fired a two-over par 218 to take medalist honors ahead of two USC players, Jill McGill at 219 and Heidi Voorhees at 220.

Softball takes two from Huskies on the road

The Oregon softball team rode the strong arm of pitcher Rachele Taylor and came through with some timely hitting to sweep Washington Saturday in a Pacific-10 Conference doubleheader in Seattle.

The Ducks needed extra innings to defeat the Huskies 3-2 in the opener before blowing Washington away 11-1 in the second game. The sweep raised Oregon's record to 13-11, 5-3 in the Pac-10.

The Ducks scored one run in both the first and second inning in the opener and had a 2-0 lead entering the bottom of the seventh inning before Washington's Karen Shaull hit a two-run single to force extra innings.

With one out in the top of the ninth inning, Oregon catcher Laura Schmidt ripped a triple, and sophomore Leanne Brooks followed with a single to drive in pinch-runner Patty Pyles for the winning run.

Taylor pitched a complete game for the Ducks and gave up nine hits and two runs to raise her record to 7-8.

Oregon jumped on the Huskies early in the second game, scoring seven runs in the second inning to put the game away. Taylor pitched another complete game, going seven innings and allowing seven hits and one run to even her record at 8-8.
