The following incidents were reported to the University Office of Public Safety and the Eugene police department from March 29 to April 6.

- A University student reported a theft on the 1200 block of Alder Street March 31. The student's car window was broken and a radar detector was stolen. The damage to the window was estimated at \$158, and the radar detector was valued at \$75.
- · A University student reported the theft of lost or mislaid property at the Valley River Center April 2. The student said she left her wallet somewhere in the mall. The wallet contained \$250 worth of traveler's checks, a bank book and a driver's license, for a total loss of \$299.
- •The Eugene fire department reported a theft of a \$300 fire helmet on the 1400 block of East 19th Avenue early in the morning of April 4. The fire department was responding to a fire alarm at the Sigma Chi fraternity, 1440 E. 19th Ave., when the theft occurred. According to police reports, firefighters arrived upon

the scene, where they saw "about 100 people, many of them intoxicated, were standing around." An ambulance and paramedics were also at the house responding to a medical call for a "partygoer who had too much alcohol."

A firefighter said he met resistance from a fraternity member when the firefighter tried to get into the house to reset the fire alarm, which was apparently set off as a prank. According to police reports, the house member told the firefighter that "this is none of your business" and "to get the hell out of here."

After the firefighter was able to reset the fire alarm, he returned to the fire truck to find a helmet had been taken off of the truck. Members of Sigma Chi and the Alpha Phi sorority who were standing outside of the party said they didn't know anything about the missing helmet. The helmet was found by a citizen on Highland Oaks Drive about 10 p.m. April 4.

 A 17-year-old youth was arrested for theft of a bicycle after being stopped for riding a bike on a campus sidewalk April 5. The boy was riding on the sidewalk with a friend when the pair were stopped by an OPS officer. The officer ran a check on the University bike identification numbers and found that one of the bikes was reported stolen Dec. 31. The boy said he bought the bike more than a year ago after mowing lawns and cleaning gutters to pay for it. The suspect was arrested after his mom was called and said she didn't know anything about her son cleaning gutters. She said her son told her he recently traded his old bike for the one he currently had.

· A 19-year-old man was arrested for DUII after going through a stop sign at the intersection of University Street and Johnson Lane April 5. According to police reports, the arresting officer found open containers in the car after pulling the man over for ignoring the stop sign. The man's blood alcohol content registered .13 on the breathalyzer.

· A 36-year-old man was arrested for theft on the 1000 block of East 15th Avenue April 6. OPS officers went to the bike racks near the Bean Complex after

OPS received calls of a man prowling around bikes in the area. When OPS officers arrived they found the suspect near the bike racks riding a bike and carrying a day pack. The suspect told the officers he was looking for his bike, which he said had been stolen earlier this year. According to police reports, the suspect said he was looking by Bean because his roommate had seen the bike there earlier. The man gave a phone number for his roommate that later turned out to be the phone number of the suspect's parents.

OPS officers called in the ID on the bike the suspect was riding and phoned its owner. The owner said she had last seen the bike at 1:30 p.m. April 5 and didn't know it had been stolen. The suspect told the officers he had borrowed the bike from a man at New Max's Tavern April 4. OPS officers found a large pair of bolt cutters, two screwdrivers and some bike tools in the suspect's day pack. He said he was going to use the equipment to "cut locks off his bike." The suspect, who was on parole for robbery and theft, was arrested without incident.
