## Men's golf in fourth; tennis gets 18th win

The Oregon men's golf team is in fourth place after 36 holes of the Southwestern Intercollegiate Invitational in West Lake Village, Calif. Jeff Lyons shot an opening-round 70 and followed it with a 71, finishing Monday at 141 to place him fifth in the tournament, highest among the Ducks.

Arizona State leads the tournament with a 568, Colorado is in second at 581, and California is third with a 582. The Ducks are in fourth place, three shots behind Cal.

Colorado's Scott Peterson leads the tournament after back-to-back 68s and is five shots ahead of Lyons.

The Oregon club crew team placed well during the weekend.

The women placed fifth in a preliminary heat at the San Diego
Crew Classic but came back to take first in the third heat of the finals,
edging Sacramento State by two-tenths of a second.

The men competed in the Husky Invite and took second in both the varsity lightweight race and the novice openweight race. In the lightweight race, the Ducks finished only three seconds behind first-place Pacific Lutheran, and in the openweight division, Oregon finished within two seconds of first place and behind Seattle Pacific.

Both teams will compete this weekend in the Corvallis Invite on the Willamette River.


