Ducks hire new women's coach

Missouri assistant coach Jody Runge has been hired as the Oregon women's head basketball coach.

"I'm very excited about the opportunity to coach at a prestigious institution like Oregon," Runge said at a news conference Friday. "I want to put Oregon basketball back on the map."

Runge, 30, was the primary recruiter for a Missouri team that finished 19-8 this season. She has also had assistant coaching stints at Florida, Alabama-Birmingham and Colorado State during her career.

Runge looked positively at the 9-18 team that she inherits.

"We have a strong nucleus coming back," Runge said. "If we

get committed, with lots of work, we can move in the Pac-10."

Runge was given a one-year contract worth \$42,000.

Runge was asked if the women's basketball budget limited the team's potential for success.

"Budget-wise, we can compete with anyone in the Pac-10," Runge said. "I know where and where not to spend money; I feel we can get it done."

Associate athletic director Barbara Walker said Runge was one of three finalists for the position but was the only candidate offered the job.

Walker was then asked if filling the position with a woman was an athletic department priority.

"Getting the best person for the

job was a priority," Walker said. Walker said she had worked with Runge at Alabama-Birmingham and the two had remained in contact over the years.

The Oregon women's tennis team continued its remarkable season this weekend by sweeping Willamette, Puget Sound, Portland and Portland State 9-0 in each match.

The Ducks raised their school record for victories to 22 with the weekend's wins, compared with only four losses.

Sara Willens won her No. 1 singles match against Willamette Saturday with a 7-5, 6-0 triumph over Carrie Beelandi. Willens defeated

Portland's Andrea Swilk 6-1, 6-0 Friday.

Sherry Fairgrieve played No. 1 for the Ducks against Puget Sound and defeated Lisa Wong 2-6, 6-4, 6-3. Fairgrieve defeated Safaa-El Mansy of Portland State 6-0, 6-1 Saturday.

Elise Adams won three matches during the weekend, defeating Karyle Kramer of Puget Sound and Annie Akita of Willamette 6-1, 6-2 each Saturday, one day after beating Portland's
