Blair, Selman lead way for women at Wazzu

Kelly Blair and Ashley Selman continued their impressive seasons, leading the Oregon women's track and field team to an easy 81-55 victory over Washington State Saturday in

Blair accounted for 20 of the Ducks' points, taking firsts in the long jump (20-4 1/2), high jump (5-8 3/4), 100-meter hurdles (13.84) and 400-meter hurdles (1:00.33), qualifying her for the Pacific-10 Conference meet in all four events.

Earlier this season, Blair set a school record in the heptathlon, qualifying her for the NCAA championships.

Selman, a transfer from USC and former NCAA champion in the javelin, threw a season-best

181-7, leading an Oregon sweep in the event. The throw easily surpassed the NCAA-qualifying distance of 170-7

The Ducks dominated the meet from start to finish, winning 12 of 16 events.

Other Oregon winners included Julie Beck in the shot put (45-2 1/4), Lisa Bedwell in the 400 (56.39), Camara Jones in the 100 and 200 (11.81, 23.94), Erika Klein in the 800 (2:14.95), and both the 400- and 1,600-meter relay teams (46.95, 3:52.44).

The Ducks will compete Saturday in the Oregon Invitational and the following weekend in the Pepsi Team Invitational with Arizona State, Kansas State and Washington State. Both meets will be at Hayward Field.

Cougars bury men with quick start

The Oregon men's track and field team fell behind early and never regained its footing, as the Ducks were crushed by Washington State 97-66 Saturday in Pullman.

The Cougars swept the hammer, took the top two places in both the javelin and the long jump and led 25-2 after the three events. Oregon won only seven of 19 events and was well behind Washington State the entire meet.

The bright spots for the Ducks were Heath Howington and Ronnie Harris, who each won

two events.

Howington took first in the shot put (56-7 1/2) and the discus (166-9). Harris won the 100 (10.60) and easily beat rival Michael Joubert in the 200 (21.13).

Freshman Jamar Williams took first in the 110-meter hurdles with a 14.30, Todd Bleakney won the triple jump at 48-0, and Jason Walton won the high jump at 6-8 3/4 to round out Ore-

Women's golf gets second in tourney

Oregon's Amy Elieff won the Oregon State Nike Invitational Saturday, but her victory did not help the Oregon women's golf team as it finished second in the team competition.

Elieff shot the best round of the tournament, a 72 in the second round, on her way to winning medalist honors, but she played as an individual and her scores did not count toward the Ducks' team total. Elieff followed her 72 with a 78 in the final round to edge out San Francisco's Juli Christopher and Washington's Sheri Vincent for the title

The Ducks finished in second place, 12 shots behind Washington in the tournament, which was shortened from 54 to 36 holes because of rain. Oregon led the Huskies by one shot entering the final round, but Washington shot 301 on Satur-

day, 12 shots better than any other team shot during the tour-

Leigh Casey, Karly Mills and Cappy Mack each shot 78 during the opening round Friday to lead the Ducks to a 313 total and the lead after the first day. Casey shot 75 Saturday to finish in fifth place, three shots behind Elieff. Casey's finish was her fourth top-10 performance this




