Two WSU football players injured

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) - Two Washington State football players riding in a pickup truck were injured when an explosive device detonated in the vehicle, police said Tuesday.

Harvey Macy "Buddy" Waldron, 22, of Bellevue was in critical condition at Sacred Heart Medical Center in Spokane, and Payam Saadat, 20, of Santa Monica, Calif., was in satisfactory condition at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle, hospital offi-

The nature of the explosive device and how it got into the truck weren't immediately clear, police

The truck hit a parked car after the device exploded Monday night, Sgt. Chris Tennant said in a news

Police and agents from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tohacco and Firearms searched the men's homes Tuesday morning. Material for making explosives was found at one of the residences, Tennant said.

Criminal charges may be pending, and there was no immediate indication that either man was asso-


