# Softball sweeps PSU; to face UW, Cal

The Oregon softball team swept Portland State on the road Wednesday and returns to Eugene to again attempt to play its home opener.

Oregon's Rachelle Taylor pitched 12 scoreless innings Wednesday and picked up two wins to raise her record to 10-9 this season. Taylor shut out the Vikings 5-0, allowing only three hits in seven innings in the first game of the doubleheader.

Taylor came back to pitch the first five innings of the second game, and teamed with Natasha Dumoski to throw a five-hit shutout in the Ducks' 6-0 victo-

Freshman Kathy Stahl led the Ducks' offense in the opener, collecting two doubles and a triple and scored four runs. Lisa Preston added three hits and two RBIs to the Ducks' cause.

Stahl was one of six Ducks to hit safely twice in the second game of the doubleheader, raising her batting average to .372. The Ducks collected 13 hits as a team on the way to the victory.

The Ducks (13-12, 5-4) are

scheduled to play Pacific Lutheran at Howe Field this afternoon at 2:30, but the Ducks have heard that before. All six of Oregon's scheduled doubleheaders this season have been postponed due to rain.

If the weather cooperates, the Ducks will play Pacific-10 Conference games against Washington and California Saturday and Sunday, respectively. The Ducks swept the Huskies earlier this month, 3-2 and 11-1 in Seattle. Washington (26-23, 2-14) is in its first season of Pac-10 softball under ex-Oregon coach Teresa Wilson.

California is scheduled to come to Eugene Sunday to face the Ducks. The Golden Bears were ranked eighth in the latest poll, but they have lost seven consecutive Pac-10 games. The Ducks and Bears split a doubleheader in Berkeley, and the Ducks won the opener 1-0 before losing the nightcap 3-1.

The Golden Bears (32-16, 10-8) are led by pitcher Michelle Granger, who leads the Pac-10 in eight pitching categories including wins (23), ERA (0.31) and strikeouts (398).

# Women's golf gets 4th in Walla Walla

The Oregon women's golf team finished in a fourth place tie at the Pacific-10 Conference championship in Walla Walla, Wash., on Wednesday, equaling its best mark ever at the conference championship.

The Ducks shot their best round of the tournament (302) in the final round to move up from the sixth place slot they were in after round two. The Ducks finished in a tie for fourth with Stanford at 934, 29 shots behind conference champion Arizona State. The Ducks also finished tied for fourth place at the Pac-10 tournament in 1991.

'I am very happy with our showing." Oregon head coach Renee Baumgartner said, "Five of the teams from the conference are ranked in the Top 15, so fourth place is very good. We beat some teams we needed to and built momentum for regionals."

Sophomore Shannon Hare led the Ducks into third place after the first round when she equaled her best round of the year with a 75. Karly Mills also was in the Top 10 after round one with a 77. The Ducks fired a team total of 314 on the first day and were tied for third place with Oregon State and USC.

Hare and Mills led the Ducks in round two as well, shooting matching 78s at the par 72 Walla Walla Country Club. The rest of the team shot in the 80s as the Ducks slipped to sixth place with a 318 total for the day.

The Ducks' 302 on Wednesday was the fourth-best round any team shot in the tourna-

ment. Mills and junior Cappy Mack led the Ducks with 75s, and Hare and senior Shannon Maier came in with 76s.

Hare's 229 total paced the Ducks and put her in a tie for seventh place. Mills finished in a tie for 10th place at 230, her second-best threeround total of the season.

"Shannon and Karly both played very solid," Baumgartner said. "Both of them gained experience at Pac-10's last season and that helped them keep their cool."

Shannon Maier, who finished in eighth place at the Pac-10 tournament last year, finished 18th this season at 235. Baumgartner said the senior from Bend appears to be on the verge of a big tournament in the post-season.

'Shannon is solid," Baumgartner said. "Her short game is really improving, and she will explode once she hits her irons as well as she has in the past. She did a good job at Pac-10's and really helped us."

Cappy Mack finished tied for 27th place with a total of 240, and Leigh Casey came back in the final round to shoot 79 and finished 38th.

The Ducks will play next at the Western regionals in Tucson, Ariz., May 13-15. The top ten teams from the 18-team field will advance to the NCAA Championships at the end of May, a tournament the Ducks have never qualified for

'We have nothing to lose and everything to gain at regionals," Baumgartner said. "My team knows that they are good so if we qualify for nationals, that's great. If we don't qualify we know we did the best we could."
