

No rain — no joke; softball wins twinbill

The Oregon softball team took advantage of a break in the weather Tuesday and swept Oregon State at Howe Field.

The Ducks (17-13, 7-5) used a burst of power in the first game to beat the Beavers 5-1, and then they got timely hits in the night-cap on the way to shutting out Oregon State 4-0.

Oregon catcher Laura Schmidt put the Ducks on top in the first game when she blasted a two-run home run over the right-field wall to give the Ducks a 2-0 lead. Schmidt's home run was her seventh of the season, breaking the previous Oregon record of six in one season, which was set by Kim Manning during the 1991 and 1992 seasons.

"Laura has been great on offense and defense," Oregon head coach Tami Brown said. "We have had 26 rainouts, so imagine what she could have done in a complete season."

After Oregon State scored a run in the top of the second inning, Oregon's Leanne Brooks connected for her second home run of the season in the bottom of the inning to give Oregon a 3-1 lead. Schmidt came back with

an RBI single in the third inning to boost Oregon's lead to 4-1.

The Ducks led 1-0 heading into the bottom of the third inning in game two, but they quickly raised the lead with four consecutive singles. Kim Kampfer led off the inning with a single, before Kathy Stahl and Lisa Preston followed to load the bases. Jennifer Piper singled to left field to score Kampfer, and Schmidt brought Stahl home on a sacrifice fly to give Oregon a 3-0 lead.

Rachelle Taylor combined to pitch 13 innings in the two games and allowed only five hits and one run to raise her season record to 12-10.

"Rachelle has to remain strong for us," Brown said. "I have confidence in our other pitchers if we need them, but I expect Rachelle to get most of the work during the remainder of the season."

The Ducks' final scheduled games are this weekend on the road against No. 18 Arizona State Friday, followed by a game against third-ranked Arizona Saturday. Brown said she is trying to schedule some home games sometime during the next week and a half.

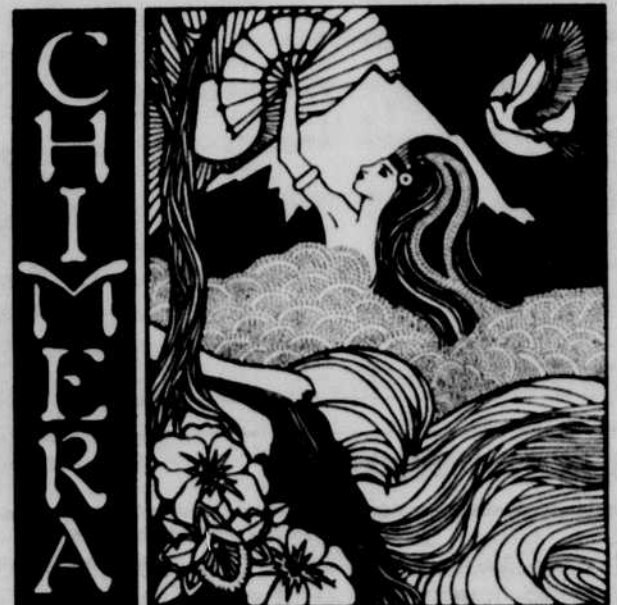
