Women to host 'big' Pepsi meet

Forget about the Washington State dual meet. Forget about the Penn Relays.

The Pepsi Invitational is the most important pre-conference meet of the season.

"This is our biggest meet of the year, other than the Pacific-10 Conference and NCAA meet," said Tom Heinonen, head coach of the women's track team. "This is it, there's no holding back.

This year's Pepsi Invitational, which begins at Hayward Field Saturday at noon, features three of the top Pac-10 women's teams, Arizona State, Washington State, and host Oregon, as well as Big-8 conference member Kansas State.

Kansas State head coach Cliff Royelto said this will be the first time his team will participate in

four-way internationally scored meet. The meet will also mark the first time the Kansas State team has competed in

"This type of meet is new to us, we haven't been involved in anything like it before," Rovelto said. "We were attracted to it because of the emphasis placed on the team competition.

Despite placing second in last year's Big-8 conference meet, Rovelto doesn't expect his team to be able to beat Arizona State or Oregon.

"We're not quite at full strength and we'll be leaving some good athletes at home, Rovelto said. "We're excited to be competing in that atmosphere with the Pac-10 programs, but it will be rough for us to win."

Although Harris likely wouldn't have run in all those races, Dellinger will not have the luxury of his usual wait-and-see use of the versatile Harris.

Instead, Dellinger will be counting on the new-comers to pick up the slack. In the 4x100 relay, freshmen DeWayne Harris, LaMont Woods, and Patrick Khoo will team with junior LaVon Pierce. Khoo, Ingram and Pierce each ran a leg in last weekend's
