Future of Africa to be discussed

An internationally known African scholar will visit the University tonight to discuss the problems and opportunities Africa faces after the end of the Cold War.

In his lecture, "Global Africa and the Black World After the Cold War," Dr. Ali Mazrui will examine how the end of the Cold War has put African countries in a weaker political position, said Saheed Adejumo, a University graduate student in history.

"During the Cold War, both Russia and the United States competed for influence in Africa," Adejumo said. "Since the demise of the Soviet Union, African countries have lost aid and the political power of balancing between the competing interests of the Soviets and the United States."

Mazrui, author of more than 20 books and 100 articles about past and present Africa, is one of the most prestigious Africanist scholars in the world today, said Quintard Taylor, a University history professor.

Mazrui received his Ph.D. from Oxford University and has lectured about African affairs on all five continents, Taylor said.

In addition to his academic work, Mazrui has been involved in many United Nations projects, ranging from human rights to nuclear proliferation, Taylor said.

"He's an eminent scholar," Taylor said. "Not many people have accomplished what he has done over the past 40 years."

Mazrui's lecture will begin at 7 p.m. in Room 150 Columbia.
