The magnificence of the Adefua African Music & Dance Company springs from a magical ability to simultaneously excite and relax.

The music appeals to all tastes while maintaining a unique quality that is pure African culture. The group includes drummers, dancers and singers, representing West-African cultures of Senegal, Nigeria, Ghana, Zaire, Guinea and Haiti.

Formed in 1986, Adefua is founded, directed and managed by Adeyemi Harris, master drummer, and Afua Harris, master dancer. Based in Seattle, Adefua tours across America teaching and performing traditional arts for all ages.

Adefua African Music & Dance Company is the Saturday night attraction at the 23rd Annual Willamette Valley Folk Festival (May 21-23) and will perform at 9 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom for \$2.

Those who have seen Adefua say it is a terrific experience.
