# Women golfers qualify for NCAA tournament

The Oregon women's golf team finished ninth at the west regional Saturday to qualify for its first NCAA championship ever.

The Ducks shot 300 in the final round at Randolph Park North Golf Course in Tucson, Ariz., to settle into ninth place at 885. The top 10 teams in the tournament advanced to the NCAA championships, which are in Athens, Ga., May 26-29.

The Ducks were led by senior Shannon Maier and junior Cappy Mack, who tied for 29th place at 221. Maier got the Ducks off to strong start with a 1-over-par 73 in the first round Thursday and followed that up with a 72 in the second round. Mack opened the tournament with a 75 before blistering the course with a 3-under-par 69 in the second round.

Oregon opened the tournament with a 298 and was in an 11th-place tie after the first round. In addition to Maier and Mack's scores, sophomores Karly Mills and Shannon Hare added rounds of 74 and 76, respectively, in the opening round.

The Ducks made their big move during the second round when they shot 1-under-par 287 as a team to move into a seventh-place tie. Mills matched Maier's 72 on Friday, and Hare added a 74 to go along with

Hare led the Ducks on the final day with a 73, and sophomore Leigh Casey added a 74 as the Ducks shot 300 and dropped into ninth place. Mills and Hare finished tied for 44th place at 223, followed by Casey

The Pacific-10 Conference dominated the tournament, qualifying six teams for the NCAA championships, including tournament-winner Arizona State.



"I feel good about my run," Hamilton said. "The first lap was slower than I planned, but I was pushed more in the second lap. I should have made myself go faster."

The Ducks finished 1-2 in the 200- and 400-meter races, with Camara Jones and Nilka Thomas picking up victories. Jones won the 200 with a wind-aided time of 23.5, followed by teammate LaReina Woods at 23.6.

'I ran a little tight," said Jones, who won the race on her 21st birthday. "I am just trying to be sure each step is faster than the previous one."

Thomas won the 400 meters at 56.50, just ahead of teammate Shawna Krasowski, who finished at 56.56.
