## Strong quake strikes Death Valley



INDEPENDENCE, Calif. (AP) - A strong earthquake rolled across a wide area of California and Nevada on Monday, but it was centered NATIONAL in a sparsely populated area

and there were no immediate reports of injuries or severe damage.

The quake measured 6.0 on the Richter scale and struck at 4:20 p.m., said Douglas Smith, spokesman for the California Institute of Technology. It was centered near this Eastern Sierra town about 37 miles east-southeast of Bishop. Bishop is about 60 miles east-southeast of Yosemite National Park

The quake was felt from Las Vegas, 150 miles to the east of the epicenter, to Fresno, about 100 miles to the west.

"It shook the heck out of this place," said Bill Woodward, airport manager at Lone Pine Airport. He said sliding doors came off the rail, one picture fell off a wall, and hanging plants started swinging.

Los Angeles Department of Water and Power crews began inspecting the city's 338-mile aqueduct, reservoirs and power plants along the Eastern Sierra but there were no immediate reports of damage, said department spokeswoman Dorothy

A dispatcher for the California Highway Patrol in Bishop said there was no apparent road damage. Inyo County firefighter Don Kunze said he had one report of a propane leak in Bishop. "It was just

a roller, wasn't real strong," Kunze said

The quake was strongly felt in California's Death Valley but didn't damage Scotty's Castle, a restored 1920s mansion that is a popular tourist attraction in Death Valley National Monument.

"It made our chandeliers swing but didn't do any damage. The castle is so structurally sound that we don't worry," said park Ranger Kate

The quake was the strongest in California since last June 29 when the magnitude-7.6 Landers quake and its 6.7 Big Bear aftershock rocked Southern California. Those quakes killed one person, injured 402 and caused nearly \$100 million in damage.

Monday's quake wasn't related to those quakes, Smith said.

The Richter scale is a measure of ground motion as recorded on seismographs. A magnitude 6 quake is capable of severe damage in the local area.

## Jury rules NY college officials liable in suit

NEW YORK (AP) - A college system's president and chancellor are liable for violating the First Amendment rights of a professor demoted for a speech criticized as racist, a jury ruled

City College professor Leonard Jeffries was removed as chairman of the black studies department after the speech.

The jury found that Chancellor W. Ann Reynolds and four trustees of the City University and City College President Bernard W. Harleston used the speech as a "substantial or motivating factor" in denying Jeffries a three-year term as department chair-

It also found that Reynolds and Harleston, but not the trustees, helped deprive Jeffries of property - his job - without due process of law, a violation of the 14th Amendment.

The jury resumed deliberations in Manhattan federal court to determine if damages should be awarded, but recessed without reaching a decision. Jeffries is suing the state-run college system for \$25 million and reinstatement as chairman of black

The same jury decided earlier this month that Jeffries, 56, wouldn't have lost his chairmanship were it not for a July 1991 speech critical of Jews and whites.

The jury had also previously ruled that Jeffries' constitutional right to due process was violated. It then deliberated on who was liable.
