Men golfers 12th after first round at regional

The Oregon men's golf team is in 12th place after shooting 5-overpar 293 during the first round of the West Regional in Provo, Utah on Wednesday

The top nine out of 18 teams will advance to the NCAA Championships in June, but the Ducks are only three shots out of fourth place and ten shots out of the lead. Arizona took the first round lead with a 283 to put them four shots ahead of second-place Fresno State.
"We're right in the hunt," said Oregon head coach Steve Nosler.

"In a five-man team event, four strokes can be made up on one hole." Oregon senior Jeff Lyons overcame illness to fire a 2-under-par 70,

putting him in eighth place. Lyons was sick on Monday and missed Tuesday's practice round at Riverside Country Club but led the

Oregon junior Randy McCracken tied his second lowest round of the year, a 73, and is in 26th place after round one. Junior Jeremy Forster shot 74 on Wednesday, equaling his best round of the year and is tied for 41st place.

Junior Ted Snavely shot 76 and Cam Martin had an 80 to round

Arizona's Manny Zerman and California's Rob Martin both shot 67 to tie for first place.
