The Emerald Athletic Trophy award is sponsored jointly by the athletic department and the Oregon Daily Emerald, and is awarded annually to a University of Oregon student on the basis of outstanding achievement in the fields of athletics, scholarship, and citizen-

from the Emerald ever had any say in who was to be awarded the trophy. Next year may be different. though, as associate athletic director Gary Gray said the Emerald may have some input into the award.

Some things are going to change next

year if the Emerald finally gets a vote.

Scott Nicolas, track - Nicolas probably would have been a finalist for the award just because of the look of Kibiri's face when he passed him in the homestretch during the Pepsi Invitational.

But Nicolas definitely made the finalist list when he vomited on a certain Emerald reporter's shoes mid-sentence during an interview moments after an incredible attempt at the NCAA qualifying mark last week.

Craig probably has the highest pain tolerance level of any University student — several times in his career he continued to wrestle after having a coach place his shoulder back into

Antoine Stoudamire, basketball - After the Ducks started out 0-9 in the conference, Stoudamire could have phoned in the rest of his season. But Stoudamire didn't quit and was simply the best guard in the conference in the final weeks of the conference season.

LaReina Woods, volleyball and track - Although she didn't quite run 'til she puked, Woods ran four races at the Pac-10 track meet, her "worst" effort being a fourth place in the 200 meters.

Woods is another athlete who had reason to grumble, but she kept a positive attitude throughout the volleyball team's disastrous 2-16 Pac-10 season.

Ronnie Harris, football and track - Although the Emerald never got to vote, I wholeheartedly agreed with the athletic department's decision to give Harris the Emerald trophy this year.


