Examine the interpretive possibilities of the finely controlled medium of tapestry through the traditional techniques of the Medieval French Gobelin Weavers. You will learn basic methods of defining line and building shapes, color blending techniques and the use of formal fades and shades. Individualized exercises will allow the beginner and experienced tapestry weaver to refine their skills. Students will have the opportunity to use a professional 8' Gobelin Style Tapestry loom. Frame looms will be available for use or purchase. Warp materials will be provided. 18 hours of instruction.
