Name games

OCA thin veil

In a recent announcement by Lon Mabon, the Oregon Citizens Alliance served notice that his organization will start a campaign to recall 14 state representatives who voted for HB 3500.

I am deeply troubled by this latest action of the OCA and pledge my help and assistance to my colleagues, regardless of party, in their efforts to resist any such recall effort. This matter transcends party loyalty and strikes at the heart of representative government.

The OCA has consistently attempted to mislead Oregonians by claiming their campaign of hate is only to guarantee that gays and lesbians are not granted special rights. HB 3500 is, in fact, their final victory, as it specifically prohibits local governments from granting special rights to people based on sexual orientation.

But, faced with the loss of their divisive agenda for fund raising, their attention turns not to the celebration but to the vilification of my colleagues. The moral bankruptcy of their crusade has been stripped of all of its cover. Oregonians can now clearly see the OCA is merely a thin and tattered veil for Mabon's blatant money-grubbing.
