

POLICE BEAT

The following incidents were reported to the University Office of Public Safety and the Eugene police department June 9-July 18.

• The University science department reported a theft June 14 of 35 gallons of ethyl alcohol valued at \$150. The theft occurred sometime between June 9 and the date it was reported. The alcohol was siphoned from 55-gallon drums. It appears that a master key was used to enter the building as there was no sign of forced entry. There is no suspect information.

• A reckless burning was reported at the 1300 block of Columbia Street June 10. The suspect told investigators that he had accidentally poured lighter fluid out of his window and then later thrown a cigarette out. The fire caused charring of the bricks and around the window. The suspect was interviewed by police, but it had not been determined whether or not he would be prosecuted.

• EPD officers responded to a report of a noise disturbance at the 1400 block of East 18th Avenue June 12 at 1:50 a.m. About 50 people were at the party when the police arrived, according to police reports. One person yelled, "It's the police. EPD is here!" A University student was cited for noise disturbance. As the officers left the premises, one person yelled, "I'm going to get my uzi and shoot all of you!" according to police reports.

• Two males, 16 and 18 years old, were cited for consumption of alcohol on unlicensed premises, minor in possession of alcohol and possession of less than an ounce of marijuana at the corner of 13th Avenue and Kincaid Street June 18 at 11:13 p.m. An OPS officer had seen the pipe and marijuana and advised an EPD officer. The suspects surrendered their pipe and marijuana to the EPD officer, were cited and then released.

• A burglary occurred at an apartment complex on the 1800 block of Harris Street June 19. A compact disc player valued at \$149 was stolen. Access was gained through an unlocked door from a shared kitchen area.

• A transient male was arrested for burglary at 7-Eleven, 1316 Alder St., June 19 at 9:30 p.m. The man had previously been cited for trespass at the store, so the clerk said she would not serve him. The man selected a bottle of beer and tossed his money on the counter. The clerk refused to accept the money and called the police after the man exited the

store. The man was arrested outside of the premises.

• A burglary was reported by the University education department June 20. A laser printer, television, VCR, computer monitor and computer valued at a total of \$5,248 were stolen. Access may have been gained through an open front window, as there were no signs of forced entry.

• A 20-year-old man was arrested for falsely representing his age at Pegasus Pizza, 790 E. 14th Ave., June 26 at 7:30 p.m. EPD officers contacted the manager of the restaurant upon arrival and were led to the suspect. The suspect had shown his fake identification to an employee of the restaurant and had become angry when it wasn't returned to him. When confronted by the officers, the suspect showed them his real Oregon Driver's License. He said that he had copied his fake identification from his real one and then adjusted his date of birth.

• EPD officers were dispatched by OPS to the University Inn, 1000 Patterson St., June 28 in response to a report of trespassing. A 42-year-old man was arrested on the second floor. He was charged with trespassing and consumption of alcohol on unlicensed premises. The man told officers that once he got out of jail, he would skip court and leave town.

• A burglary was reported at Espresso Roma, 825 E. 13th Ave., June 29 at 5:20 a.m. Access to the restaurant was gained through the courtyard, and there was severe damage to the doors. Police found papers and smashed equipment strewn on the floor. A partially consumed croissant was found in a cooler, but no other theft was reported. Damage to the store totaled \$400.

• A greenhouse at the University Institute of Molecular Biology was burglarized on June 1. Three bulbs — valued at a \$559 total — used for growing plants were stolen. Access was gained through a broken window. Three recent burglaries occurred at this

greenhouse previous to this incident. The greenhouse was burglarized again on July 14. Eight grow light bulbs valued at a \$2,350 total were stolen. Access was gained through the front door. On July 18, two heat lamp bulbs valued at \$300 were stolen from the University Physical Plant. Authorities believe that the incidents are related and believe the thieves may have made a mistake in stealing the heat lamp bulbs.

• Officers responded to an alarm at Renny's Landing, 1214 Kincaid St., at 12 a.m. July 5. The front door had been kicked in, but the suspects did not enter. Authorities believe that the alarm may have scared them off.

• Police and fire officials responded to a report of a 1990 Jeep Wrangler being consumed by flames at 13th Avenue and Ferry Street July 9 at 2:40 a.m. Damage was estimated at \$8,500. Officials are trying to determine if the fire was started on purpose or if it was an accident.

• The Phi Gamma Delta fraternity house reported a burglary July 11. Sports trophies, photos and award plates were stolen, and photo composites had been damaged. A billiard table was overturned. The cost of property stolen or damaged was estimated at \$5,150. Access was gained through a window.

• Three males were cited for minor in possession by an OPS officer through an EPD officer at the Bean Complex, 1416 Columbia St., July 11 at 11:50 p.m. The suspects had been drinking cans of beer.

• A 32-year-old man was arrested for menacing behavior July 15 at 6 p.m. The suspect had reportedly confronted two women on the corner of 13th and Kincaid and demanded that they pose for a picture. The women were frightened and began to cry. The suspect reportedly pulled a knife on them and said, "Smile or I'll kill you!" The suspect was later taken into custody after being identified by the women.

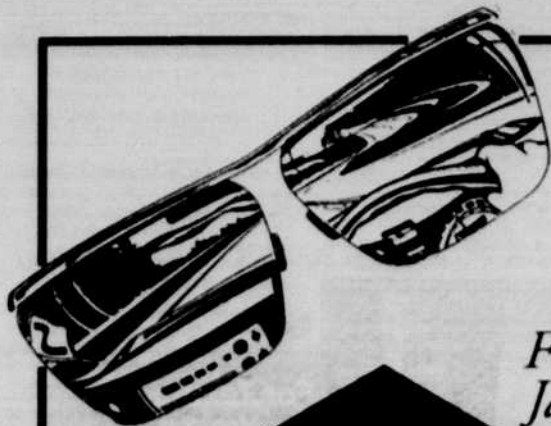
