

POLICE BEAT

The following incidents were reported to the University Office of Public Safety and the Eugene police department July 26 to Aug. 9.

- A 25-year-old male was arrested for assault on the 1300 block of Alder Street July 26. Officers responded to a report of a domestic dispute and took the man into custody after seeing evidence of injuries on the woman he had been fighting with. The woman told police she would sign a complaint.

- A University student reported a theft of her bicycle from Leo Harris Road behind Autzen Stadium July 27. The \$300 mountain bike had been locked.

- A woman reported an act of public indecency at Lawrence Hall July 27. She encountered a partially clothed man kneeling in an aisle on the second-floor library. The man was looking at a book and masturbating. According to police reports, the woman said, "That's absolutely disgusting!" The man picked up his shorts and shoes and fled the building. The suspect is described as a black male between 30 and 40 years old, about 5-foot-11 and with a runner's build.

- A 23-year-old male was cited for consumption of alcohol on unlicensed premises at 11:30 p.m. July 30. According to police reports, an officer saw the man drinking beer from a plastic cup in front of a house, and the man told the officer that he was old enough to drink. The officer advised him to dump the beer, which was about one-quarter full. Instead, he drank the beer, and the officer cited him.

- A 35-year-old male transient was arrested for providing false information to a police officer on the 400 block of East 19th Avenue July 31. According to police reports, the man was camping illegally and had been warned to leave two days previously. The officer asked the transient why he didn't go to the Mission, and he said he didn't like it there. The man gave the officer a false name and date of birth, and he was arrested.

- A University student reported a theft of a bicycle valued at \$450 July 26. It had been locked to another bike, but the cable had been cut. The student called later and said he had recovered the bike.

- A theft from a vehicle was reported at the 1700 block of Columbia July 30. The driver's side window was smashed and a jacket was stolen. The jacket was valued at \$40, and the damage to the

window was estimated at \$60.

- A burglary of a bicycle was reported at the 400 block of East 13th Avenue Aug. 6. The woman who reported the burglary said that she woke up to find the front door unlocked and her bicycle missing. The bicycle was valued at \$350.

- A 48-year-old male transient was arrested for trespassing at the 1000 block of Alder Street Aug. 6 at 11 p.m. The man screamed at police to leave him alone and was verbally hostile and aggressive. The man was arrested at the scene.

- A burglary was reported Aug. 7 at the Sigma Nu fraternity, 700 E. 11th Ave., Aug. 7. The door was unlocked and six shirts were stolen. Televisions, VCRs and bottles of alcohol were left untouched. The six shirts were valued at \$350.

- A 30-year-old man was arrested for second-degree shoplifting and assault Aug. 9 at the University Bookstore. The suspect was observed by bookstore security leaving the bookstore with a pair of sunglasses he did not pay for, according to police reports.

When the suspect was contacted by two security personnel, the suspect said he had taken the sunglasses because his eyes were sensitive to the sun. He said someone had broken his glasses the day before, according to police reports.

Security attempted to question the suspect further and had to restrain him when he became unruly. The conflict moved outside of the bookstore's lobby area onto the sidewalk, where another man attempted to help the suspect by grabbing one of the security officer's necks, according to police reports.

The suspect then eluded security and ran into the Kincaid Street-East 13th Avenue intersection. One of the security personnel caught up with the suspect and "swept" the suspect's feet out from under him, according to police reports. EPD arrived shortly and took the suspect into custody.

The suspect was also charged with assault after hitting one of the security officer's noses, causing him to bleed, according to police reports.

The man who helped the suspect elude security outside of the bookstore was issued a citation for harassment for grabbing the security officer's neck. The man said it "looked like two skinheads were beating up a longhair" and attempted to help, according to police reports.
