she has already broadened her perspective about Latin America.

"I know as far as international understanding," she said, "my international experience was to go to Costa Rica, and frankly, Costa Rica is one of the best developed Latin American countries. And so my perspective of Latin America was warped in a good way."

"Talking with Susan about a true third world country such as the Dominican Republic has really broadened my view. They're not all like that."

Not that there aren't still a few problems to be ironed out. Pastorino said there is some separation between American groups and Asian groups. She said it's not hostility or anything, but the language barrier has created a few problems.

"As time goes on," she said, "I think we'll get along really well. But we need that time."

Students in the college are from all over the world.

There are representatives from Bosnia, Indonesia, Tanzania, Australia and Sri Lanka. In addition, their fields of study range across the border, from art history to psychology.

But even though the students are taking some of the same classes as other University students, they believe they are learning more than their peers.

"We're going to learn a lot about how the world as a whole relates, and how it interacts," Pastorino said. "Growing up overseas, I've seen a lot of the choppiness and how it doesn't work. And to just see the perspective of educated international students and professors that have all these different backgrounds, it seems like all of us together can come up with conclusions that will be more valid than a person who doesn't have a global perspective."

Alexander said the college should push the entire University in the right direction.

"We're really going to start to see how and why the world is going to be moving toward an international element."
