Arizona destroys Trojans, 38-7

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) Arizona's offense finally played as well as its top-ranked defense.

Dan White threw three touchdown passes and scored another, and Chuck Levy returned a punt 59 yards for a TD as No. 12 Arizona embarrassed Southern Cal 38-7 Saturday.

White, a 6-foot-5 sophomore transfer, was pleased but reserved after the best game and most significant win of his brief collegiate career. The victory boosted the Wildcats to 5-0 (2-0 in the Pac-10), their best start since 1975.

The Trojans fell to 2-3 and 1-1.

"It just feels good to have my first good college game," White said. "I think we ran the ball effectively, which opened up our passing game. Everything finally clicked."

"Arizona played a great football game. They beat us soundly. They executed every part of their game plan and we, of course, didn't," Southern Cal coach John Robinson said.

White completed 14 of 21 passes for 228 yards while hitting Troy Dickey on 14- and 10-yard touchdown passes and another of 54 yards to Cary Taylor.

**Oregon State 30,
Arizona State 14**

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) Oregon State quarterback Don Shanklin, a sophomore, rushed for 117 yards and two touchdowns in his first college start before being hurt in the fourth quarter as the Beavers upset Arizona State 30-14.

The Beavers were 17-point underdogs and their offense hadn't scored in the eight previous quarters.

But Shanklin, pressed into starting duty because of injuries to Ian Shields, had touchdown runs of 1 and 31 yards. He also completed all five of his passes for 43 yards before leaving the game with a bruised left foot with 9:05 to play.

The injury is not believed to be serious. And when Shanklin comes back, he'll be the starter.

"Yes, Don Shanklin won himself a starting position today," Pettibone said. "Don improved tremendously in practice this week, but you don't know what will happen until you get out on the field."

Oregon State (2-3 overall, 1-2 Pac-10) beat Arizona State on the field for the first time since 1971, before the Sun Devils joined the Pac-10. The Beavers won by forfeit over Arizona State in 1979.

The Beavers, whose option attack amassed 419 yards on the ground, broke a nine-game Pac-10 losing streak and have won two games in a season for the first time since 1989.

**Notre Dame 48,
Stanford 20**

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) Notre Dame (5-0) gained a season-high 475 yards in beating Stanford 48-20 on Saturday, and both the running and passing games seemed to click.

"I thought that our offense played very, very well," Holtz said. "We got a tremendous performance from everybody on our line — our receivers, our backs, our quarterbacks."

Holtz needn't have worried about his team scoring enough points to keep pace with the Cardinals' high-powered passing attack. Even kickoff returner Clint Johnson put up some points, running one back 100 yards for a touchdown and setting up an earlier score with a 79-yard return.

The Irish took a 27-6 lead in the third quarter on quarterback Kevin McDougal's 19-yard scoring run, his third touchdown of the day.

And although Stanford (2-3) closed to 34-20 later in the period, Notre Dame got contributions from two unlikely sources to add two more touchdowns.

Lee Becton, who missed the Purdue game with an injured hamstring and was questionable for the game, scored on an 8-yard run with 1:41 left in the third quarter. In the final period, Paul Failla came in when McDougal strained his back and connected with Derrick Mayes on an 80-yard scoring pass.

**Washington State 12,
Pacific 0**

STOCKTON, Calif. (AP) Delton Johnson's 2-yard run was Washington State's only touch-

down, but it was enough as the Cougars shut out Pacific 12-0 Saturday.

The Cougars (3-2) handed Pacific its first shutout since 1989 and its first blanking at home since 1984.

In the first appearance by a Pac-10 team in Stockton since 1968, Washington State held the Tigers to just 156 yards overall — just 61 in the opening half. Pacific (1-3), which had a streak of 47 consecutive games without being shutout, missed a pair of field goals and threw an interception inside the Cougar 20.

**Washington 52,
San Jose State 17**

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP) Washington used a reverse flea flicker to produce a 52-yard Damon Huard touchdown pass in a 52-17 victory over winless San Jose State Saturday at Husky Stadium.

"We're going to create new plays every week," coach Jim Lambright said with a smile.

After pummeling hapless San Jose State (0-5), all the Huskies are smiling, particularly first-year quarterback Huard.

Criticized by the local media after a 12-for-23, 102-yard passing performance in a 35-0 win over outclassed East Carolina the previous week, Huard was almost flawless against the Spartans.

He completed 15 of 17 passes for 247 yards and three touchdowns — the 52-yarder to Jason Shelley, a 5-yarder to Richard Thomas and a 3-yarder to Richard Thomas.

Huard also had a 54-yard pass to Shelley, who caught four passes for 142 yards.

The Huskies rolled up 556 yards — 288 by passing and 268 by rushing — in winning their school-record 16th straight game at Husky Stadium. The 556 yards were the most since getting 608 in a 1991 game against Nebraska.
