tight end Willy Tate. Oregon boosted the lead to 30-0, as wide receiver Cristin McLemore caught a lateral from O'Neil and threw the ball 20 yards to Tate for the score with 10:17 left in the second quarter. Tommy Thompson missed the ensuing extra point.


Deadwiler set one school record with 234 yards receiving and tied another with 11 catches.

Cal running back Lindsey Chapman provided the offense for the Bears as he ran for scores of one and 61 yards. The second score came on Cal's first play of the second half, as Cal made a habit of not only scoring against the Ducks' defense, but scoring quickly. Cal had three one-play touchdown drives, and another that took nine plays but lasted only 1:05.

Oregon came right back on a 13-yard touchdown run by Sean Burwell to boost the lead to 37-10, but that was the last time Oregon saw the end zone Saturday.

Barr found wide receiver Damien Semien down the right sideline for a 46-yard touchdown, bringing the Golden Bears within 38-20 when the two-point conversion failed. Cal blocked Thompson's punt at the end of Oregon's next possession, and Eric Zomalt took the ball 15 yards, cutting Oregon's lead to 38-27.

Oregon had a chance to put the game away early in the third quarter when O'Neil found Deadwiler for a 77-yard completion, giving the Ducks the ball on Cal's 11-yard line. Running


back Ricky Whittle ran nine yards on the next play, giving Oregon a second-and-one at the two-yard line, but the Ducks turned the ball over on downs.

Thompson booted another field goal to give the Ducks a 41-27 lead, but Cal responded on its next play with a 72-yard scoring pass from Barr to Semien to get Cal within seven points at 41-34 with 4:53 left in the game.

After Oregon's next drive stalled, the Bears took over for the last time with 2:22 remaining in the game, and scored just one minute and five seconds later.

Lost in the shuffle of Cal's comeback was a huge day by the Oregon offense, which racked up 614 yards in total offense. O'Neil threw for 313 yards, and Whittle and Burwell ran for 116 and 101 yards, respectively.

The Ducks will have no time to reminisce about Saturday's missed opportunities, as USC comes to town this weekend.
