

Husky coach hospitalized during Cal game

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Washington assistant coach Myles Corrigan is in stable condition today following nearly four-and-a-half hours of emergency open-heart surgery.

rioration of the heart's main artery, said hospital spokesman Mark Hurdy.

The surgery began shortly after midnight Saturday and ended early Sunday morning. Corrigan had further surgery Sunday to restore blood flow to his right leg.

Corrigan was out of immediate danger by Sunday night but was due to remain at Alta Bates for about a week.

He will be sidelined for the rest of the season, leaving coach Jim Lambright with two vacant assistant slots. The positions opened when Don James resigned as head coach and when Lambright stepped up from defensive coordinator.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. (AP) — Washington State flanker Deron Pointer, who caught 10 passes for 255 yards, and UCLA linebacker Jamir Miller, who registered five sacks, earned Pacific-10 Conference players of the week honors.

Washington special teams players Jason Crabbe and Scott Greenlaw also shared the weekly honor announced Monday.

Pointer, a senior, set a school record for

yardage and had touchdown receptions of 53, 50 and 24 yards in the Cougars' 44-25 win over Arizona State.

Miller, a junior, keyed the Bruins' defense, which limited Brigham Young to just 25 yards rushing and forced six turnovers, in a 68-14 victory over Brigham Young.

Crabbe, a senior, and Greenlaw, a sophomore, teamed up on a big special teams play in the Huskies' 24-23 win at California. Greenlaw recovered Crabbe's onside kick with two minutes remaining, setting up Washington's winning touchdown drive.

Oregon student tickets for the Oct. 23 Oregon-Washington game in Seattle went on sale Monday. Three hundred tickets are available at \$12 apiece.

This year marks the fourth time in five years the Ducks will have to travel to Washington. The Ducks have lost six consecutive games at Washington dating back to 1981. The Huskies beat Oregon 24-3 at Autzen Stadium last season.

Corrigan, 49, the Huskies' tight ends and placekickers coach, approached team doctors during the first half of the Huskies' 24-23 victory over California on Saturday and complained of losing all feeling in his right leg.

Trainers immobilized his leg with a splint, but when his condition did not improve through halftime, he was taken to nearby Alta Bates Hospital.

Tests indicated Corrigan was suffering from a dissected aorta — substantial dete-

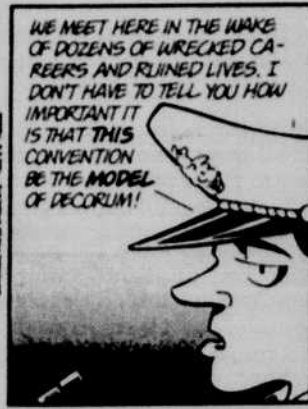

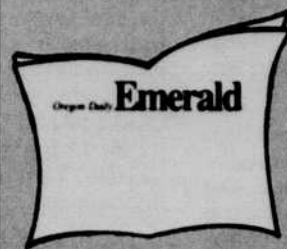
