

# UCLA prepares for Arizona after scare against OSU

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A not so funny thing almost happened to UCLA and Arizona on their way to Saturday night's Pacific-10 Conference showdown at the Rose Bowl — both were in jeopardy of being tied or beaten.

The No. 15 Bruins beat host Oregon State 20-17 on Saturday thanks in part to a missed 32-yard field goal by Oregon State's Brooke Knight with 4:22 to play. The kick, which would have tied the game, was wide by inches.

Earlier in the day, No. 7 Arizona beat Washington State 9-6 because Aaron Price of the Cougars barely missed a 49-yard field goal with two seconds left that would have tied the game.

"I felt very fortunate about our game at Oregon State," UCLA coach Terry Donahue said Monday. "The game could

have gone in the other direction. It was nice to win one of those games."

UCLA lost its first two games of the season — to California and No. 6 Nebraska — by a total of three points.

Since those narrow defeats, the Bruins have won five games in a row, their longest winning streak since they opened the 1988 season with seven straight wins.

Oregon State entered the game with a 3-4 record, having won only one game in each of the 1990, 1991 and 1992 seasons.

"I think the Oregon State team played very inspired and they played very well," Donahue said. "We played hard."

"If they're not good, than we're not any good either. They gave us all we wanted. I'm glad we were able to maybe not play that well and win."

Arizona (7-0 overall, 4-0 in the Pac-10)

is alone atop the conference standings. UCLA (5-2, 3-1) is tied for second with Southern Cal and Washington, which is ineligible for the Rose Bowl.

Arizona has already beaten Southern Cal, and doesn't play Washington this season. So a victory over UCLA would put the Wildcats in great shape in the Rose Bowl race and all but eliminate the

Bruins from contention.

"We'd better not let them win," Donahue said.

After Arizona, the Bruins have road games against Washington State and Southern Cal sandwiched around a home game against Arizona State. After UCLA, the Wildcats have a home game against Oregon followed by road games against California and Arizona State.

Donahue is well aware that Arizona leads the country in rushing defense (15.1 yards per game) and total defense (208.1 yards per game).

"Right now, Arizona's got the best defense in the history of the NCAA against the rush," he said. "That's a shocking statistic. Arizona is a great, great defensive football team."

The Oregon men's tennis team opened its season Saturday at home, splitting two matches with Idaho at the 15th Ave. Courts.

The Ducks opened play with a 5-4 win in the first match. Oregon's Lee Kirner, Josh Prager and Mike Goldstein all won in straight sets in singles action.

Kirner and teammate Christian Oelke, won a tough match

against the Vandals' Mark Hadley and Niren Hall, 9-8. The team of Goldstein and Jeff Strong sealed the Duck victory with an 8-1 win over Ryan Stayton and Doug Anderson.

In the second match, Oregon won three of five singles matches, but dropped two of three doubles contests, losing the team competition, 5-4.

The Ducks are off until Nov.

5 when they will compete in the Rolex Regional Championships at Stanford.

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — Two top high school basketball players plan to sign national letters of intent to attend Washington State University next year, school officials said.

Chris Griffin, a 6-foot-2, 190-pound guard from Jesuit High in Carmichael, Calif., and Carlos Daniel, a 6-7, 215-pound forward from Fairview High in Boulder, Colo., said Monday they will sign with the Cougars.

Griffin averaged 14 points, six rebounds and four assists per game last season with 35-2 Jesuit.

Daniel averaged 18.6 points, 11 rebounds and four blocked shots per game as a junior last season.

Both said they planned to sign national letters of intent to attend WSU during the early signing period, which runs Nov. 10-17.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. (AP) — Washington's Russell Hairston

and Napoleon Kaufman were selected Monday as the Pacific-10 players of the week for their performances in the Huskies' 21-6 victory over Oregon.

Arizona placekicker Steve McLaughlin earned special-teams honors for the second week in a row.

Hairston, a junior cornerback, had three interceptions and three tackles to lead Washington's defense, which held the Ducks' potent offense without a touchdown.

Kaufman, a junior tailback, rushed 21 times for 142 yards and two touchdowns, including a 58-yard scoring run. He also caught four passes for 25 yards and returned two kickoffs for 52 yards, rolling up 219 all-purpose yards.

McLaughlin, a junior, kicked field goals of 53, 40 and 32 yards to account for all Arizona's points in the Wildcats' 9-6 victory over Washington State. McLaughlin's 32-yarder won the game with 1:33 remaining.
