songs on Nirvana's Bleach, the benchmark of albums where the lyrics mean nothing to the song. And "Don't Have Time For You" is a cool mood song, sounding like it was recorded in a basement with one mike hanging from the ceiling in the middle of

But the shining moment of the album is the title cut. If you're a sucker for songs with loud guitars and sudden drum-filled breaks a la Helmet, this song will kick you in the teeth.

Creep Diets is not a perfect album, but it's hard for many bands nowadays to come up with a sound that is original, not to mention 11 or 12 songs within that sound that are original.

Neither Fudge Tunnel nor Season To Risk are all that original, but at least Fudge Tunnel do a respectable job of reworking an all-to-familiar sound into a listenable album.

PERFECTLY **GOOD GUITAR** ***

ohn Hiatt's new album, Perfectly Good Guitar, is just that. It does not have the lyrical soul of Hiatt's last three solo efforts, but it stands up as a very entertaining romp through his

Hiatt's main concern in the past five years has been family narratives and matters of love. This time around he is just having fun.

Hiatt has left behind his band from the last two albums and brought in some new blood for this album. The main musical difference is that Hiatt has gone from the country sound he had been toying with for a while and tries to just play rock 'n' roll.

Most of the songs hover around the theme of trying to break out of the mold.

The first track, "Something Wild," is about just that. He is tired of the sedentary family life and needs to return to his wild roots. There is nothing complicated here. It's just straight rock.


